# Worship with us this Sunday, January 24

The title of the sermon is Anxiety or trust? and is based on I Corinthians 15:45-57. Pastor Tim Schrag comments, "Contrast the attitudes of Adam and Eve, and Jesus, as they pondered the prospect of the death of their physical bodies."

A word about our worship visuals Quilters have named blocks after Bible stories for generations. The Bible was the primary literary resource in many early American homes, providing inspiration for nineteenth century quilters, who mostly used scraps and outgrown or clothing beyond repair to sew covers to keep their loved ones warm. Throughout our True Story study series, a variety of quilt blocks representing Bible stories or themes will be presented.

This week's block is The Garden of Eden (Gen 2: 8 & 10). It features a blue central cross representing the four rivers said to flow from the Garden. The green squares could be trees. The pattern is known to be well over 200 years old.

Mennonite Disaster Service Trip, March 20-26, Bastrop, TX. Our congregation has reservations for up to 20 volunteers to work in Bastrop, TX. Bastrop is located in central Texas, 30 miles South East of Austin. The most destructive wildfire on record in Texas destroyed 34,000 acres in Bastrop County in September 2011. Approximately 1600 homes were burned in that county. Reports are that half of the homes were uninsured or underinsured. Nearly 12 percent of the population lives below the poverty line. Sleeping for volunteers at this site will be in bunk trailers, 5 persons per trailer, so "groups" of 5 men and 5 women would work out
