Worship with us this Sunday, February 14

The title of the sermon is God of the Journey and is based on Genesis 12:1-6 and Hebrews 11:8-16. Pastor Tim Schrag comments, "Notice the sense of pilgrimage. Is 'being settled' a worthy goal, or a subtle temptation?"

A word about our worship visuals Quilters have named blocks after Bible stories for generations. The Bible was the primary literary resource in many early American homes, providing inspiration for nineteenth century quilters, who mostly used scraps and outgrown or clothing beyond repair to sew covers to keep their loved ones warm. Throughout our True Story study series, a variety of quilt blocks representing Bible stories or themes will be presented.

Children of Israel Originally called "Chosen Children," this block design dates back to colonial New England. There may be only two variations to the pattern itself, but there are more than fifty references to the children of Israel in the Bible. (Gen 48:16)
