Worship with us this Sunday, May 15

The sermon title is *Square Wheels Go Bump* and the Scripture is 2 Corinthians 5:16 - 6:2. Pastor Tim Schrag comments, "The ministry of reconciliation" (II Corinthians 5:18) is what Christ gave us as our 'charge'. That plays well with Mennonites. But let's not forget verse 19 which follows. This is the first (and primary) reconciliation, all else follows."

Scripture Focus We begin our worship service with a Scripture Focus each week that comes from the congregational study of the Bible in which we are currently engaged. Each worship service is based on the lesson from the previous week's Sunday School study.

A Word about our Worship Visuals Quilters have named blocks after Bible stories for generations. The Bible was the primary literary resource in many early American homes, providing inspiration for nineteenth century quilters, who mostly used scraps and outgrown clothing beyond repair to sew covers to keep their loved ones warm. Justice for Suriname Indigenous People

Meghan Reha writes with this invitation about an issue of justice.

You know that I spent time in Bangladesh with MCC, but what is less well known is that prior to that, when I lived in Seattle, I was involved with some friends, Dan Peplow and Sarah Augustine, who have been working with indigenous peoples in Suriname to advocate for fundamental human rights and economic justice for the past 12 years. Their program is called the Suriname Indigenous Health Fund, and there is lots more information at the link. I have also included more details in this Letter, which is posted on the MCN

I have been granted a audience, tomorrow, May 12 at 2:30 with Senator Dick Durbin to request his signature on a Senate letter requesting a change in the practice of the Inter-American Development Bank to provide more justice to the Suriname people. I am extending an invitation to anyone from Mennonite Church of Normal to come along for the meeting, and to join me in this advocacy journey, wherever it takes us.
