

Peace Bridges

Madeleine Yoder, Ron and Leanne Schertz's granddaughter, is serving in Phnom Penh, Cambodia, with an NGO called Peace Bridges Organization (PBO). The mission of this Christian organization is to train community leaders and pastors in conflict resolution skills. They, in turn, go back to their communities to train others in conflict resolution methods. PBO's work parallels so well the mission of Mennonite Central Committee that MCC offers some support by providing an MCC worker to join the staff of about 25 Cambodians working at PBO.

Madeleine has just completed an on-line project to bring in supporters for a reforestation event PBO holds annually. This event is intended to be a positive and constructive solution in a situation that would otherwise be the incubator for conflict, often violent. Since 90% of the population of the country is dependent on the land and environment for their basic living, deforestation is devastating for the rural population.

This appeal is unique for Peace Bridges. Their intent in going into a crowdfunding campaign is to establish a safe and respected on-line portal for potential donors, who would otherwise find it complicated to send financial support. If this project is successful, Peace Bridges will become a permanent member of the GlobalGiving website.

Madeleine explains it herself: "The organization I work for is starting a crowdfunding campaign through GlobalGiving with the goal of raising \$5,000 from 40 donors by June 30th. The current project we are raising money for is our annual tree planting event in Prey Lang forest, an area of Cambodia that has been heavily deforested. If we are able to reach our goal, we will graduate from GlobalGiving's Accelerator Program and become permanent members, which means we will be able to continue receiving online donations for other projects as well.
