

Electronic Sign Update

The comments and opinions received are greatly appreciated. Because of comments and questions received, we did an in-depth review of invoices and learned the following: the initial cost of the sign was \$28,519, not \$42,000. Maintenance since 2013 has been \$8,684, not \$26,000. We also located some original discussion and rationale documents. These are under careful review. Additional comments are certainly welcome.
