2019 Spending Plan and Congregational Meeting

Our next Congregational Meeting is planned for Sunday, January 20th at 1:00 pm. Our agenda will include the 2019 Spending Plan, the Annual Reports, a Design Team 2019 Plan, and a Pastoral Transition Plan. The proposed 2019 Spending Plan and the 2018 Annual Reports are available linked and are also on the Entrance Table, and the website.

Summary of 2018 Spending Plan, Income and Expenses

For 2018 the Spending plan was \$495,356. The income for 2018 was \$494,439. The Expenses for 2018 were \$476,531. This results in a \$17,908 excess of income over expenses!

The Financial Stewardship Committee is very grateful for the generous support offered during 2018. As we enter 2019, we encourage your continued support as the Mennonite Church of Normal seeks to fulfill its mission in Normal, IL and around the world.

As a result of the recommendation of the Spending Plan Task Force that we have a reserve fund of about 1.75 months expenditures, or about \$72,000, the \$17,908 will be placed in such a reserve fund. That fund is identified on the Balance Sheet as Net Assets: Unrestricted - Prior Years. Current balance for that funds with the \$17,908 included is \$69,575.
