House Blessing with Chalk

A Chalk House Blessing is a way to begin the new year by asking God to bless our homes. It is reminds us to invite Jesus to be a daily guest in our homes, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

Help yourself to a piece of chalk available in the Atrium.

1. Using chalk, mark above or beside the home's entryway, or on the front porch steps,

- 2. The 20 and 19 stand for this year, 2019. The + represents the Cross.
- 3. The C + M + B has two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the Magi, Caspar, Melchoir and Balthazar. They also are abbreviations for the Latin words that mean, May Christ bless this house (Christus mansionum benedicat).
  - 4. Say, "May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout this year, 2019."
  - 5. Pray,, "Visit, O lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with your love; and grant that we show your love to each other and all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you. Guide us, comfort us, strengthen us and give us your peace. In Jesus Christ we pray, Amen."

With time the chalk will face. As it does we let the meaning of the written symbols sink into our hearts and become manifest in our words and actions.
