The sermon title is *The Bottom Line(s)* and the Scripture is Luke 19:28-40 and Philippians 2:5-11. Pastor Tim Schrag comments, "The segment of Jesus' life we call Passion Week spans an incredible range of events and emotions. It begins with the Triumphal Entry (Palm Sunday), and ends with the crucified Jesus entombed on Black Saturday. It is profitable to read the story of this week, in its entirety, and in each Gospel account."

Lenten Season Worship

Throughout scriptures for Lent, there is a theme of our human need and how God longs to fulfill and satisfy us as nothing else can. We can find ourselves lost, thirsty or alone. God hears our cries and as the bulletin artwork suggests, God provides for us. Confession is a key spiritual practice during Lent - both confession of our sin and brokenness <u>to</u> God, as well as our confession of faith <u>in</u> God. In our confessing, we discover that we are always held in God's love, and God provides abundant forgiveness. The worship visuals - rocky, barren, and dry wilderness landscape - symbolically set a scene that evokes our deepest spiritual longings as we prepare during Lent for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection at Easter.

Congregational Updates Announced in Worship April 7, 2019

We as a congregation have been richly blessed by the talents and hard work of two members who have stepped up and provided leadership in two specific areas of ministry.

Chris Culbertson has served as leader to the youngest of us and their families. Leading the ministry of our children and families through Christian Education and beyond, Chris has carefully and enthusiastically provided strong leadership in programming and in supporting the Christian Education committee.

Lauren Satchwell has served in dual roles as the Administrative Assistant, and as leader of our Youth Ministry program. She has provided consistency and follow-through in the front office and strong leadership in working with our youth, sponsors, and the Youth Ministry Committee.

Both Chris and Lauren agreed to serve in their respective roles for a specified length of time. Chris' work will end June 30 of this year, and Lauren indicated a desire to work through MCUSA convention which occurs July 2-6 this summer.

Last Monday, April 1, Lauren submitted her resignation for the Administrative Assistant position effective this

coming Thursday, April 11. We have known from the beginning of her work with us that she was actively seeking work which aligned with her schooling and training. We are thrilled for her that she has accepted a new position locally with American Buildings Company.

Regarding her work with the youth, Lauren shared with youth, parents, sponsors, and the Youth Ministry Committee last week:

"I want to assure you that there will be no interruption to Youth Ministry programming. When I signed on to be a sponsor in June 2017, and then the Youth Ministry Leader in January of 2018, the understood term of these assignments was always through Convention of 2019, which I plan to fulfill. As you know, there are many unknowns regarding staffing needs for our church in the future. I will be conversing with the Church Board about their needs moving forward and in no way want to stifle an opportunity for the Youth Ministry program going forward, but also do not want to leave without a clear succession plan."

There will be a time for the congregation to more formally offer thanks and congratulations to both Chris and Lauren later as the end of their work nears.

For now, the Board is actively seeking out short-term and long-term solutions, and, as always, we welcome congregational input. As always, we ask for your prayer support as we work through the many changes that we are embracing in the coming months.

Kits for men and/or women are need to share with Jobs Partnership and Labyrinth Outreach services, two organizations in our community offering reintegration services to persons formerly incarcerated. Gently used backpacks or small duffel bags are also needed in which to pack the kits. Bring to the red tub in the atrium, or a donation may be made to MCN, for use by the Outreach Committee to purchase the items on your behalf.
