Church Board Update

This is an update on various items before the Church Board.

- 1) the search process for the Administrative Assistant position is well underway. We hope to conclude this process with a good hire in the next 4-6 weeks.
- 2) the search process for an appropriate intentional interim continues to progress well. As interim pastors are not plentiful, it would be surprising if our timetable aligns exactly with the interim. It is highly likely that we will be without a pastor for a period of time, and we will need to manage church affairs on our own. This congregation has been through this circumstance before, and we are confident in the skills and resourcefulness found in our church family to adapt and skillfully move through this process. We covet your support and prayers as we continue our work.
- 3) 19 years ago this congregation embarked on a wonderful mission to partner with Heartland Head Start. We have partnered with them in the nurture of hundreds of children and their families over the years. Many people in our congregation have assisted in this program by investing hours upon hours of volunteer work. Recently, the Board was informed that Head Start would be leaving MCN to move into a new space that could better accommodate their needs. School has finished for the year and the move out is expected to be complete by the end of this week, May 24. It is important to note that this separation was not the result of any discord or discontent. Changing federal regulations could not be adequately addressed at our facility so a new site was found. We are grateful for the opportunity we have had in partnering with Head Start in this very important service venture.

Note to the Congregation from Tim & Sue

Pastor Tim's retirement at the end of August was announced last year. As that date fast approaches, many of you have asked about our plans for the future.

Our beloved house in the Oak Hill subdivision has been sold, and we are moving to Goessel, Kansas. Whyever rural Kansas, you might ask?! Our eldest son Ben and his family live on and work a family farm just four miles out of town. We are excited to be close enough to attend school and church events for our grandsons, who will be in the eighth and sixth grades in the fall. And Sue's parents Lee and Mary Alice Hertzler moved to Goessel in the spring, a brief two-block stroll from our new home.

Since we are closing on the Bloomington house in July, our big move will happen in July. We have a furnished house here where we will live until the end of August.

The fall months will be devoted to getting settled in, attending ballgames, meeting new friends, reconnecting with old friends, and of course, finding a new church family. We plan to spend several months in the Phoenix area next winter, where daughter Sara and her family live. We are very much looking forward to spending extended time with them, especially young Simon, who barely knows his grandpa and grandma Schrag. Of course, we are moving farther away from son Andy and his family in Chicago, but retirement does come with the benefit of more discretionary time for travel.

Long term, we intend to spend four to six months annually volunteering with things like SOOP (Service Opportunities for Older Persons) and MDS (Mennonite Disaster Service). In fact, we have already applied for and been accepted as leaders for MDS sites in the future. Our travel trailer should see some good use over the next years! Tim may also take on some church work eventually, as an interim, for pulpit supply, mentoring new pastors, as opportunities present and schedules permit.

Settler Solidarity in Light of the Trail of Death - A Panel Discussion

First Mennonite Church of Champaign-Urbana invites you to join them for an evening of fellowship and learning with those participating in the <u>Trail of Death Pilgrimage course</u> through Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary.

You are welcome to come to FMC-CU on Thursday, June 6 for a potluck from 6-7 p.m. and panel discussion to follow from 7-8 p.m.

In September of 1838 during the Trail of Death forced removal, a Potawatomi elder died between Catlin and Sidney, not far from the current site of FMC-CU. As the story goes, white settlers from Sidney came together to build a coffin to bury the elder with dignity. What can we learn from this story about the power of lament and empathy? What might it look like to practice solidarity with Indigenous Peoples today as settlers and immigrants in Turtle Island? As people of faith who pursue God's *shalom*?

Panelists will include David Horst Lehman and George Godfrey (Citizen Potawatomi Nation) as historians and storytellers, and participants from the Trail of Death Pilgrimage group. Pastor Michael Crosby will serve as the moderator.

New Pavilion

The Church Board has approved construction of a pavilion on the South lawn which was a piece of the Campus Use Plan affirmed by the congregation in 2013. A 5-member planning group was assembled late last year to gather feedback, evaluate design characteristics, and produce detailed drawings, construction timelines and estimates at varying cost levels and features for a pavilion which maximizes potential uses and aesthetics while considering MCN's Mission Statement.

Joe Haney and Roger Clemmons have agreed to manage the construction process, which will begin in June. Volunteers will be needed for various tasks. Funds currently in the Campus Use escrow account will be utilized, but an anticipated \$10-12,000 will need to be raised to complete the project.

The Board is excited about the opportunities for community, fellowship and social interactions this new outdoor venue will provide! We look forward to this new addition to our campus.
