School Kits

Last year MCC shipped 78,035 school kits to Jordan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Iraq, Zambia, Ukraine, Somalia, Burkina Faso, Canada and the U.S. During the months of July and August Mennonite Women will be collecting supplies for school kits. Bags will be provided by Mennonite Women and you can find them in the back of the sanctuary with the list of supplies needed. They will be collected in the red tub. The list of supplies are as follows:

4 spiral or perforated page ONE SUBJECT notebooks (8.5x10.5 in) 70 sheets.(DO NOT BUY 5 SUBJECT NOTEBOOKS)

8 new unsharpened pencils

1 ruler (flat, good quality; must indicate 30 cm; inch markings optional)

12 colored pencils (in package)

1 eraser (such as pink pearl)

2 new black or blue ballpoint pens

1 small ALL METAL pencil sharpener (MENNONITE WOMEN WILL SUPPLY THE SHARPENERS; THEY CAN BUY THEM IN BLUK THORUGH AMAZON). Plastic case pencil sharpeners are not accepted because they are poor quality and do no last long.

Disaster Relief at Hardin, IL

Sisters and brothers,

We are all aware of what a devastating month May was for Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Iowa. East of the Mississippi, we also experienced storms causing tornadoes, floods, and other damage. Since February, Illinois has been experiencing localized flooding along the Mississippi and other river systems. By the end of May, Illinois, and much of the midwest had experienced the wettest twelve month period on record. As you know, many of our farmers have only been able to get into their fields to plant in the last three weeks or so.

One area in Illinois where widespread flooding occurred was Hardin, IL, between the Mississippi and the Illinois Rivers. Hardin has been flooded for months and the waters have finally subsided.

Illinois Baptist Disaster Relief is taking the lead. The work will primarily involve much out, demolition of drywall and fixtures, and sanitizing the exposed studs and sheathing in homes. Thirty or more homes were affected. The IBDR will be working in Hardin from July 5th through the month of July. They are looking for both day volunteers as well as those who can stay over longer.

Celtic Pilgrimage 2021 co-led by Jane Roeschley and Karla Minter

Early planning is underway for a Celtic Pilgrimage in June 2021 to the Celtic holy sites of Iona (Scotland), Glendalough (Ireland) and Kildare (Ireland).

Pilgrimage offers an opportunity to travel slowly and mindfully, with the intention of connecting spiritually with God, with fellow pilgrims and with sacred places.
