Announcement from Church Board

On behalf of the Board, I (Cindy Ropp) have two matters to bring before you this morning (Aug. 18, 2019).

The first concerns Transitional Ministry. In the last several months, you have heard the terms transitional ministry and intentional interim. We have been informed that the correct term is Transitional Ministry, and we will use that as we move forward.

Per conference and denominational guidelines, the calling of a transitional minister comes from the supervising body of a congregation, in our case the Church Board. This process includes receiving recommendations from the conference minister, conducting interviews, and calling a Transitional Minister.

At this time, the Board has selected a Transitional Minister and a verbal agreement has been made. We hope to have the signed copy within a few days.

Beginning in January of 2020, Pastor Gary Martin will be joining us as Transitional Minister.

Gary Martin is licensed and credentialed through Central District Conference. He is a graduate of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (AMBS) in Elkhart, Indiana.

He has served as an instructor at AMBS, in Church Development for Central District Conference, and as Director of Development at Chicago Mennonite Learning Center.

Beginning in 2005, Gary has served as Transitional Pastor with 9 separate congregations including Silverwood, College Mennonite, Middlebury, and Indianapolis in Indiana; Roanoke in Illinois; Franconia in Pennsylvania; Central Mennonite in Archbold, Ohio; and most recently, St. Louis Fellowship in Missouri. Gary also leads Transitional Ministry training across the denomination.

Gary's experience and his significant interest in our congregation well equip him to provide the support and direction we are seeking during this time of transition.

More information and details of his intended work here will be presented at a congregational meeting on Sunday, Sept.29.

And now to the second item:

It is the role of the Church Board to craft and set policy for the church. To that end, early in 2018, the Board initiated a process to discern God's will for our congregation regarding our relationship with persons who identify as LGBTQIA+. A Design Team was created, and we engaged in learning, listening, discussions, and prayer. Input was gathered in a variety of venues from persons in the congregation - talking and listening around tables, individual conversations, corporate prayer, and through the written word.

Today, I bring before you the two new policies that will guide our life together moving forward. These policies are aspirational in nature and speak to God's call for our congregation.

Based on church-wide discernment, the Church Board believes the Mennonite Church of Normal aspires to be a safe and welcoming congregation for all, as aligned with our Vision Statement.

By unanimous agreement, the Church Board adopts the following policies effective Aug. 13, 2019.

All people of any race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, age, education, or ability who confess faith in Jesus Christ, are welcome to participate in the full life and ministry of the Mennonite Church of Normal.

Furthermore,

All people of any gender or sexual orientation who confess faith in Jesus Christ, may become members, be married, and are eligible for all volunteer, staff, and pastoral positions at the Mennonite Church of Normal.

We thank you all for walking this long journey. Thank you for sharing your thoughts with conviction, for listening carefully, and for praying for the Design Team, the Board, and this congregation. It is today that we mark a new future moving forward as we seek to grow into this new vision. It will require intentional work. The Board is actively looking at what this might mean for us, and we will be sharing more about this with you at the congregational meeting in September.

Copies of these new policies are being placed in your mailboxes and will be ready for you to take home at the close of worship.

May God be with us all in the days ahead.

- 8 new unsharpened pencils
- 4 spiral or perforated page ONE SUBJECT notebooks (8.5x10.5 in) 70 sheets.(DO NOT BUY 5 SUBJECT NOTEBOOKS)1 small ALL METAL pencil sharpener (MENNONITE WOMEN WILL SUPPLY THE SHARPENERS; THEY

CAN BUY THEM IN BULK THROUGH AMAZON). Plastic case pencil sharpeners are not accepted because they are poor quality and do no last long.
