### From our Transition Pastor, Gary Martin The Transitional Period Begins at Home!

To Sign Up use this link. If you don't have access to the internet helpers will be at a table in church the first several Sundays in January.

WHAT? Gary Martin, our transitional pastor, would like to visit EVERY household, ideally at your residence, but if you prefer, at the church or another location. The visits will take place Jan 5-13; 19-22; Feb, 2-9; 15-23. These dates will be expanded, as needed.

WHY? These informal visits are the important first step in the transition process, enabling Gary to understand the congregation by first hearing each individual voice. It also helps him get acquainted and learn names. A composite report of the "congregation's voice" will be presented to the congregation early in March, along with recommendations for specific transition events through May, and a rough projection for transition priorities for the rest of the year.

**HOW?** To achieve this challenging objective in the limited time frame, we appeal to your flexibility in scheduling a visit in advance. While 100% participation is impossible, getting as close as possible maximizes the many benefits of this effort. Those in warmer climates during winter have the option of scheduling a phone visit.

To stay focused on visit objectives (and on schedule), please "do not feed the pastor" even if it's meal time. (Be assured, Gary enjoys meals in homes, but that can happen throughout the remainder of the transitional period!)

Visits will be about 90 minutes (or less). Two individuals can schedule a visit together, if that feels more comfortable. Please schedule during weekdays, if you are available then, so evenings and weekends are open for those who work weekdays. When possible, Gary would like to meet when children are home, so he can hear their voices too. They are free to leave after a few minutes. And it's fine to schedule when children are away, if that's your preference.

Gary wants to hear whatever you want to share about yourself or the congregation, or any questions about the transition period.

- 1. What brought you to MCN?
- 2. What keeps you at MCN?

3. Are you aware of your spiritual gift? (1 Cor. 12:1-11; Rom. 12:1-8; Eph. 4:1-16; 1 Peter 4:10-11)

## Change in Church Office Hours

With the retirement of two pastors and the imminent arrival of our transitional pastor, life seems to be a bit in flux here at Mennonite Church of Normal. The Board very much appreciates the willingness of church members to step up and offer assistance as it is needed.

This past June, we welcomed Laurie Vial to our church office. She has worked diligently for us, getting used to how we do things, and learning new systems.

Since Pastor Jane's retirement, Laurie has become the sole in-the-office staff person during the week. Many things have come to her that would typically have been handled by one of the pastors. She is now completing month-end, quarter-end, and year-end reports for the first time.

Laurie has communicated to the Board that she is needing assistance in handling the additional demands. Together, we have worked out a plan. Starting Monday, Dec. 23, office hours will be 9-12, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. If you call or come to the office in the morning, there will be a church volunteer who will be greeting people and answering the phone.

In the afternoon, Laurie will still be in the office working, but the office will be officially closed, unless there is an emergency. Laurie will continue to work from home on Wednesdays.

We anticipate that during the first several weeks of Pastor Gary Martin's time with us in January, there may be need for additional help while he is out of the office doing congregational visits. It is our intent for this schedule to be in place until his congregational visits are complete.

Currently, we have arranged for the first three weeks of coverage. If you are interested in volunteering for a morning, please reach out to Melika as soon as possible. Bring something with you to fill your time if it is a relaxed morning and there isn't much for you to do.

Cindy Ropp, Church Chair, and Melika Hershberger, Chair of Pastoral Council, are also available to respond to calls or emails at any time. Do not hesitate to reach out. We want to be as responsive as possible to the needs of our church family during this time of change.



### Mennonite Relief Sale


