Scripture: Isaiah 2:1-5 & Matthew 24:36-44

From our Transition Pastor, Gary Martin The Transitional Period Begins At Home!

WHAT? Gary Martin, our transitional pastor, would like to visit EVERY household, ideally at your residence, but if you prefer, at the church or another location. The visits will take place Jan. 5-14; Jan. 26-Feb. 2; Feb. 9-16. These dates will be expanded, as needed.

WHY? These informal visits are the important first step in the transition process, enabling Gary to understand the congregation by first hearing each individual voice. It also helps him get acquainted and learn names. A composite report of the "congregation's voice" will be presented to the congregation early in March, along with recommendations for specific transition events through May, and a rough projection for transition priorities for the rest of the year.

HOW? To achieve this challenging objective in the limited time frame, we appeal to your flexibility in scheduling a visit in advance. While 100% participation is impossible, getting as close as possible maximizes the many benefits of this effort. Those in warmer climates during winter have the option of scheduling a phone visit.

To stay focused on visit objectives (and on schedule), please "do not feed the pastor" even if it's meal time. (Be assured, Gary enjoys meals in homes, but that can happen throughout the remainder of the transitional period!)

Visits will be about 90 minutes (or less). Two individuals can schedule a visit together, if

that feels more comfortable. Please schedule during weekdays, if you are available then, so evenings and weekends are open for those who work weekdays. When possible, Gary would like to meet when children are home, so he can hear their voices too. They are free to leave after a few minutes. And it's fine to schedule when children are away, if that's your preference.

Gary wants to hear whatever you want to share about yourself or the congregation, or any questions about the transition period.

Congregational Meeting to vote on TAP set for Dec. 15

On Wednesday evening, Oct. 16, a meeting was held with the congregation to discuss Adult Sunday School strategies as well as an inquiry into renting our former Head Start space by The Autism Project - known as TAP. A presentation was made by the directors of the program and good conversation was had around tables. TAP is an ISU-based program serving the needs of children with autism and their families. The Board has reviewed and discussed feedback received from the congregation and is now ready to bring forward a proposal to you, and it reads as follows:

"The Church Board recommends that Mennonite Church of Normal rent space in the church building to The Autism Project (TAP), a program run by faculty and students at Illinois State University to meet the needs of children with autism and their families, from Jan. 1 through Dec. 31, 2020."

Details of the agreement will be finalized by the Office Manager, the Financial Stewardship Committee, the Church Board, and TAP administration as is our typical process.

There will be a congregational vote taken at the rise of worship two weeks from Dec. 1, on Dec. 15.








The MCN Campus Use Plan drawing will be on display for the next several weeks so everyone can study it.

Creation Care Confab

Periodic info and musings to help open conversations about God's amazing Creation

The trees in a forest are often interconnected by subterranean networks of mycorrhizae, fungal strands that inhabit tree roots. The mycorrhizal symbiosis enables the fungus to forage for mineral nutrients in the soil and deliver them to the tree in exchange for carbohydrates. The mycorrhizae may form fungal bridges between individual trees, so that all the trees in a forest are connected. These fungal networks appear to redistribute the wealth of

carbohydrates from tree to tree. A kind of Robin Hood, they take from the rich and give to the poor so that all the trees arrive at the same carbon surplus at the same time. They weave a web of reciprocity, of giving and taking. In this way, the trees all act as one because the fungi have connected them. Through unity, survival. All flourishing is mutual. --Robin Wall Kimmerer


