From our Transition Pastor, Gary Martin The Transitional Period Begins at Home!

To Sign Up use this link. If you don't have access to the internet helpers will be at a table this coming Sunday.

WHAT? Gary Martin, our transitional pastor, would like to visit EVERY household, ideally at your residence, but if you prefer, at the church or another location. The visits will take

place Jan. 19-22; Feb. 2-4; 9-12; 16.

WHY? These informal visits are the important first step in the transition process, enabling Gary to understand the congregation by first hearing each individual voice. It also helps him get acquainted and learn names. A composite report of the "congregation's voice" will be presented to the congregation early in March, along with recommendations for specific transition events through May, and a rough projection for transition priorities for the rest of the year.

Those in warmer climates during winter have the option of scheduling a phone visit. To stay focused, please "do not feed the pastor." (Be assured, Gary enjoys meals in homes, but that can happen later). Visits will be about 90 minutes. Two individuals can schedule a visit together, if that feels more comfortable. Please schedule during weekdays, if you are available then, so evenings and weekends are open for those who work weekdays. When possible, Gary would like to meet when children are home, so he can hear their voices too. They are free to leave after a few minutes. And it's fine to schedule when children are away, if that's your preference.

Gary wants to hear whatever you want to share about yourself or the congregation, or any questions about the transition period.



Why Transitions?

Milepost 15

Dating and marriage have been used as a metaphor for the relationship between pastor and congregation. Both parties get to know each other first, and then discern whether to enter into a long- term relationship. From there on, both parties need to keep working at the relationship. I believe it's helpful to broaden the metaphor to any relationship, whether with a friend, physician, lawyer, auto mechanic, nanny or building contractor. For relationships to be most effective, both parties need to have embraced their past, know who they are now, and where they are headed in the future. When all three are in place, one becomes much more attractive to the other. Congregational transition is an ideal time to assess all three areas, as it is for any life transition.

Without transition, a pastoral search committee is tasked with this daunting effort. They may seek counsel from the congregation via surveys, but it is impossible for a committee to do this work thoroughly. Transition involves the entire congregation in the preparation a search committee does before considering candidate profiles. When search begins, the congregation has already supplied what the search committee needs, so profiles can be considered immediately.

Another benefit of transition: potential candidates have advance informal notice of a general time when a search process will begin. Example: if a pastor is contemplating resignation, and is aware that MCN will begin searching in approximately 12 months, s/he may delay resigning for a year, to be available at that point. While transition does delay the start of a search process, it usually shortens the time in, and definitely increases the quality of the search process. Quality candidates place a transitioned congregation above one which has not, in his/her discernment.

Last night, the Church Board affirmed an initial schedule for the next two months:

- Feb. 18: Household visit project completed
- Feb. 25: Church Board reviews Visit Project Report and Recommendations
- March 8: 10:45 a.m. Report/Recommendations presented to the Congregation
- March 29 9:30 a.m. 2:15 p.m. First Congregational Process Event: "Re-membering MCN" For now, please make note of these dates. No schedule is ideal for everyone in a

large church, so we appreciate your flexibility, so transition work can stay on schedule. More details will be provided soon. I will continue to visit interested households after Feb. 18. But for your input to be included in this initial planning, please sign-up online. If you are away

from Normal, we can visit via phone or Skype.


Missing

Studies show that youth who grow up in religious communities have lower rates of suicidal ideations than youth who do not. However, for one segment of the population, the statistics are opposite. LGBTQ persons who mature in religious contexts experience higher rates of suicidal ideation and attempts than LGBTQ persons outside the church, according to research by Jeremy J. Gibbs published in 2015.




