God Provides, We Decide

February sermons and dramatic monologues will examine four characters in the Book of Ruth. This story sheds light on how our decisions intersect with God's providence. A soap opera motif lightens up this serious theological study.

Ruth is about ordinary people, facing ordinary life events: feasts and famine; birth and death; romance and loneliness; singleness and marriage; stability and uncertainty; celebration and depression; real estate purchases and foreclosures; insiders and outsiders; mothers-in-law and daughters-in-law; sudden appearances of unknown relatives; gossip and manipulation; mystery and suspense; immigration, ethnic prejudice, health care, and welfare. The story is 3300 years old, but has divine cosmic significance for today.

Ruth explores the mystery of how our decisions open up opportunities for God's grace to flow into our lives and the lives of others. The themes apply to life and transition work: taking risks, emotional honesty, doing the right thing, embracing the outsider, and trusting in God's grace.

Gleaning Right is coming soon to a sanctuary near you on the MCN channel, Sundays at 9:30 a.m. Special guests include Orpah (Feb. 2), Naomi (Feb. 9), Boaz (Feb. 16), and Ruth (Feb. 23). They will be available for questions, selfies, and autographs after the service. To prepare, please read the entire story, and reflect on the following questions:

- 1. Was there an Elimelech in your family history: someone who made a decision taking your family into a radically different experience?
- 2. Have you felt abandoned by a loved one who died, or was emotionally distant or unavailable in other ways?
- 3. Have you avoided or taken a less traveled road in the past? Does the Holy Spirit have a less traveled road direction for MCN?

Transition Updates:

- 1. How is transition different from an interim? An interim simply covers pastoral responsibilities during the search for long-term leadership. A transition enhances the search process by involving the congregation in self-study and vision discernment before the search begins.
- 2. Household visits: 41 completed; 23 additional scheduled. That means 60% of active MCN households will have participated. That's good, but it would be even better if we could reach 70%! Thanks for encouraging others to sign up for a visit by Feb. 18, so more data is available to develop a plan for transitional efforts.
- Important dates: March 8, 10:45 a.m. Presentation of the Visit Report and Recommendations.

March 29: 9:30 a.m.-2:15 p.m. "Re-membering MCN" -the first congregational process event.
