

Parable of the Mailboxes

"... God has put all parts of our body together in the way that he decided is best." 1 Cor. 12:18.

The Apostle Paul uses the human body as a metaphor: The Holy Spirit assembles the congregation!

Most congregations do well with welcoming newcomers: "We are so glad to have you here!" The subtle, unspoken message that follows separates congregations into two categories.

• Not-yet-missional congregations communicate: "We can't wait for you to learn the ropes so you can help us do what we are doing."

• Missional congregations communicate: "We can't wait to see how your gift will change and enrich us."

The first message implies a static congregation: new folk are expected to change. The second message

implies a dynamic congregation: everyone changes a little with each new person.

Consider church mailboxes: most churches overhaul the mailbox system once a year. Between overhauls, you "make do" with changes. When someone leaves, an empty box is not a problem. But what do you do with new folk? The empty boxes are rarely in the right place because the Holy Spirit does not pay attention to the alphabet. You either put the new name close to the correct location, or move many boxes so the newcomer is in the correct location. It's not about mailboxes! It's about how we view the new folk among us. Do we tend to think: "They should learn the ropes so they can help with what we are doing" or each new person will help us keep changing because they bring new gifts the Holy Spirit knows are needed here?" The message, "We will all move a little, so you can fit into this congregation exactly where you belong," is very attractive to newcomers.

In Sunday's episode of "Gleaning Right," we examine why Boaz was able to do the right thing. Reflection questions:

1. Is my life or MCN life characterized by humility?

2. How important is the wellbeing of the Bloomington/Normal area to MCN (Jeremiah 29:4-7)?

As we begin preparations Mennonite Women would like to encourage all to come and help make some things for the Relief Sale. The following six weeks will be designated as work evenings every Wednesday to make 100 gifts to sell at the Sale. ALL are invited to come and share their gift. Together we can make 100 nonfood items.
