

Lent 2021: Deep calls to Deep

The Midweek Wednesday

On this Fifth Sunday in Lent, we go deep in the earth, to be called to deep growth. God promises, "I will put my law within my people, and I will write it on their hearts." In Pastor Gary's sermon, "An inside job" (Jeremiah 31:31-34, John 12:20-33), we are called to deep growth, which is possible by following Jesus' example as he faced crucifixion. Joe Culpepper is planning and leading this service.

Milepost 440 Something to Celebrate in March

Long, long ago, a young boy was carried across the sea to a foreign land, and forced into slavery. He prayed daily for freedom. He escaped, and boarded a ship carrying hounds to another country. He cared for the dogs in exchange for his fare. After many hardships there, he found his way back to his homeland.

In a dream one night, babies in the land where he had been a slave, pleaded with him to return and tell them about Christ. He entered a monastery to prepare, and was sent as a missionary to the nation where he had been enslaved. A century later, there were monasteries throughout this formerly pagan nation, sending missionaries to other nations.

Although St. Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland, he was English by birth. He wrote that one cannot *not* live in the presence of God: *God beneath you, God in front of you, God behind you, God above you, God within you*. He urged people to become aware of God's presence.

In my 55-year sojourn among Mennonites, I have heard it said frequently: "We need to add a young person to this committee or project. We need to hear their voices." On rare occasions, we might actually put a younger person in charge of something really important. In my experience, the results were almost always astounding. But then we return to being satisfied with hearing their voices.

Scripture and Church History have numerous stories of God calling very young people to be in charge of really important things, like St. Patrick.

I followed the Voices Together project from a distance over the last seven years.

I knew it would be impressive in its forward-looking perspective. But the completed project far exceeded my expectations, on that score. The editorial "quartet" had two in their 30's and two in their 40's. Historically speaking, I believe that's on the younger end of the spectrum for being "in charge" in Mennonite institutions.

The younger generation has been instrumental in leading MCN through the last twelve challenging months, in areas of music, technology, biblical teaching, youth ministry, and worship. Outcomes have been impressive because they were "in charge" and empowered.

As MCN makes some significant decisions in the next few months, I encourage us to see the many among the younger generation, who are unquestionably "ready for prime-time." And not just to help us get things done, but to actually "be in charge." -Gary Martin

Outreach Committee Update

The Outreach Committee continues to reach out to the community. We supported a food drive in December and were pleased with the donations received. Along with the Fellowship Committee, we will be holding another drive on March 20. There are many people in need in our community. Please donate as you are able.

We continue to work with our community partners (SHOWBUS, United Way and BN Welcoming) to deliver boxes to immigrant families. Boxes of food and necessities were delivered to 15 families twice in February. Adding fresh fruits and vegetables to these deliveries has been greatly appreciated.

BN Welcoming disbursements are approved by our committee. So far \$19,909 has been donated to this fund and \$14,656 has been disbursed for expenses of immigrant families. Needs continue so please consider donating to the fund. It's easy - to donate to BN Welcoming—please use the PayPal button on the BN Welcoming tab on the church website. The Committee supports a suggested adult Sunday School class, possibly this spring, designed by MCC called "Peaceful Practices". The curriculum is designed to help individuals and congregations reflect on and practice how they engage with interpersonal conflict. The Peace and Justice committee is also supporting this class.

Although we haven't been able to worship in person, there are various ways to stay connected with MCN family and friends. Please continue to support the congregation as we anxiously wait to open our building and get back together in person. We miss you!
