#### Lent 2021: Deep calls to Deep

On Palm Sunday, we go deep into the current, to be called to deep hope. Holly Zehr has the sermon this Sunday, based on John 12:12-16, and Psalm 118: 19-29. Holly writes: "Much of modern life is lived on the surface. We scroll. We skim. We tread water. Jesus calls us to something deeper--a deep dive into the current of God's will, God's love. God's adventure. As we investigate Jesus' triumphal entry on this Palm Sunday, here at the beginning of Passion week, we learn the courage it takes to abandon the surface and dive deep for hope and purpose. If you have little ones at home, please have a scarf, large plant leaf, towel or other longish object to wave when I ask them to during the sermon." Wayne Hochstetler has planned, and will lead this service.

After worship this Sunday: We gather as a congregation for a presentation of the Proposed Vision Statement, and to respond with our questions, in breakout groups. The Proposed Vision Statement was e-mailed separately this morning. It is also available at a link in today's Milepost.

**Questions for reflection:** How is God calling you to deep hope? What steadies you when life rushes onward?

**Easter Sunday:** we will remember Jesus' death, and celebrate his resurrection, with Communion. Elsa Raab is planning this service.

**Reminder: The church building remains closed**, despite it being used last week for Relief Sale activity. If you see a vehicle or two in the parking lot, that only means staff are working. ## **Milepost 447 A New Direction**

By 2024 Mennonite Church of Normal will be :

- a congregation that is equipping all to learn about, walk with, and live out the teachings of Jesus in daily life;
- a dynamic faith community that nurtures and nourishes relationships, so that our care and understanding of each other is deepened;
- an active faith community, developing significant and meaningful relationships through expanding our care for and understanding about/with those beyond MCN.

The full statement, and background information, was emailed this morning, and is available here. The proposal was truly a congregational effort, beginning with 60 participating in three breakout groups in January, where common priorities began to emerge out of many diverse ideas. The group of 13 who attempted to synthesize all of the group conclusions in February & March, also brought differing perspectives to the second step in the process. Everyone acknowledged it was hard work, but clarity and unity grew. The substance of the final draft emerged in the third meeting, which I missed due to an emergency. (Feel free to connect the dots!) Several independent sources reported excitement in the zoom room that night, and awareness of the Spirit's presence. This draft was shortened to a more appropriate length, in a fourth meeting. If you participated in January group, we believe you will see priorities in this proposal which you discussed there. If something very important to you is missing, it's likely because that will continue without needing congregation wide effort. On March 28, we'll focus on asking and answering clarification guestions, and begin the discussion. On April 11, discussion will continue, and if we are ready, action till take place. Please continue for the Spirit's presence among us, to lead us to unity and commitment for these new priorities. - Gary Martin


## MCN Comforter Collaboration:


