In his sermon, "Believing with Hope and Resilience," David Boshart, President of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (Elkhart, IN), invites us to believe that as we interact in the world, we are the evidence of Jesus' resurrection. Gary Martin has planned, and will lead this service.

Milepost 461 WHAT IS JESUS, THE HEAD OF MCN, CALLING US TO BECOME AND DO?

That was the question we started with back in January. I think it has been answered clearly in the proposed Vision Statement:

By 2024 Mennonite Church of Normal will be

- a congregation that is equipping all to learn about, walk with, and live out the teachings of Jesus in daily life;
- a dynamic faith community that nurtures and nourishes relationships, so that our care and understanding of each other is deepened;
- an active faith community, developing significant and meaningful relationships through expanding our care for and understanding about/with those beyond MCN.

The essence of the vision is in these three goals. They are essentially about being. "By 2024, MCN will be a congregation, a dynamic faith community, an active faith community.... The objectives sound like a lot of doing, but they will lead to a more centered focus on being. The goals call us to go deeper in our love for God, each other, and neighbor.

Breakout group reports on March 28, included these one-word responses to the entire statement: ambitious, well worded, active, attainable, exciting, good, comprehensive, well done, great, grateful, outward focus, enthusiastic, and remarkable. The straw poll results from six groups which reported: 45% affirm with excitement; 50% affirm; 5% need more time.

A common concern expressed was, "There's nothing in the statement about

_____.Does that mean _____ won't happen anymore?" A vision statement names a few priorities which will shape all of congregational life. It is not intended to be a list of all the things we do. MCN's significant involvement in the Relief Sale, will continue as it has! But as we do, perhaps we'll find a way to go deeper in understanding why the relief needs are so overwhelming in our nation and world, how we can change our lifestyles or advocacy efforts, and in developing mutual relationships with those we serve. MCN will continue to worship, but with greater

attention given to all three goal areas.

Potential structure revisions, will result in more individuals with experience and vision for going deeper in one of the three goal areas, being on a team charged with overseeing the goal they are passionate about.

Affirming the Vision Statement, simply means saying yes to this congregational direction (the three goals), for the next three years. We don't know what we'll encounter along the way which may reshape some of the objectives. But as Mary told the Disciples on Easter morning, we know that "Jesus is going before us."

The Illinois Mennonite Relief Sale would like to Thank the MCN for allowing us to host our online auction in the church. It was a central location for everyone and the facilities were good for our photo shoot. We were able to leave the items in the church, until they sold in the auction, which took place last week. We have a total from the sale of \$31,000. Quilts were the major part of the auction, but we had other items too.


