Lent 2021: Deep calls to Deep

Christ is risen! We celebrate Jesus' death and resurrection in Holy Communion on Easter Sunday. Jesus' resurrection calls us beyond mere belief, to transformed living. Mary was more than a messenger of the Good News (John 20:1-18). Her transformed living, enabled the Disciples to move beyond their fear, to become bold messengers of Jesus' resurrection. In Pastor Gary's sermon, "Christ is Alive! Live the Feast Prepared for All," the feast metaphor in Isaiah 25:6-9, encourages us to abundant living today. This Easter, we go "Deep in the feast, and are called to deep living." Elsa Raab is planning, and Ben Roeschley will lead the service.

Response Ritual: The vessel which held stones during Lent, should now be empty! Use it to hold a feast!

Questions for reflection: How is God calling you to deep living? Can you see your life as feast, in some way?

Opportunity for Virtual Fellowship after Easter Service:

We are offering a time to connect with other MCN households after the Easter service! We did this at Christmas and enjoyed visiting with folks! If you'd like to participate, just stay on the Zoom link after the service and you'll be put into a group of 5-6 households for 20 minutes of chatting, then regrouped for another 20 minutes. Include the kids!

Thanks for the good work last Sunday! A personal note: I had planned to take last weekend off a while back. When last Sunday became the time to present the vision, it was good timing to be away, so MCN leaders could make the presentation. Regarding health concerns—I have felt fine for several weeks now. All is well on that front.

The heart of the proposed Vision Statement is the three goals, not the specific objectives:

By 2024 Mennonite Church of Normal will be a congregation that is equipping all to learn about, walk with, and live out the teachings of Jesus in daily life;

a dynamic faith community that nurtures and nourishes relationships, so that our care and understanding of each other is deepened;

an active faith community, developing significant and meaningful relationships through expanding our care for and understanding about/with those beyond MCN.

To summarize the goals: Over the next three years, MCN will be *intentional* in deepening our walk with Jesus, our relationships with each other, and our relationships beyond the congregation. To say YES to this Vision, means affirming these three priorities, and recognizing that greater intentionality will require some changes. All aspects of congregational life will adjust their efforts to meet the goals.

The objectives under each goal are best viewed as illustrations for now. As the vision is pursued, they may be adjusted because the Holy Spirit will show you even better ways to accomplish the goal or reveal new opportunities. It's helpful to read them with *imagination*. That's why there are few details as to how or when things will be offered. For example: when Christian Education classes are referenced, you will not be limited to 10:30am on Sunday mornings at 805 S. Cottage Ave.

Equipping everyone to deepen their walk with Jesus, can happen in all kinds of places and times. The third goal, expanding our care for and understanding about and with those beyond MCN, will hopefully go beyond only responding to needs. It will lead you to greater understanding of the causes of hunger, homelessness, violence, racism, injustice, inequality, etc., and changes in lifestyle and engagement in the world.

One of the criteria the Structure Evaluation Task Group is using in discerning recommended revisions is, "A structure should facilitate vision accomplishment." 
