Mennonite Church of Normal Ascension Sunday May 16, 2021

Focus: We celebrate Jesus' Ascension by reflecting on a story which illustrates what can happen when God's people are empowered by God's Spirit—the point Jesus made just before ascending. Many Christians catalogue the David & Goliath story (1 Samuel 17) under "children's story." Many Mennonites just avoid it because of the violence. In doing so, we miss an important point the text makes before the violence: *God always wins the battle*. God often wins the battle and saves a community, through an individual who steps up, when everyone else is frozen in fear. What five things did David bring, in addition to bread and cheese, to enable God to win this battle? Do we have access to the same five? David: was *aware of* God's call on his life; had vision; put the community first; had a healthy self-understanding; knew his Spirit-given gifts.
