The church at Corinth was confused about Spirit-given gifts. In 1 Corinthians 12, Paul clears things up with two points. The Spirit has given each of us a special way of serving others (v. 7), emphasizing the variety of gifts. In vv. 24b-27, God assembles these Spirit-given gifts in a special way, using the human body metaphor. What are implications for MCN as we pursue the new Vision, and consider structure revisions?

Current Covid Statistics

IN ORDER TO KEEP THE CONGREGATION AWARE OF WHERE WE STAND IN RELATION TO RE-OPENING THE CHURCH BUILDING, THE WELCOME HOME TASK GROUP WILLFREQUENTLY POST CURRENT STATISTICS FOR MCLEAN COUNTY.

From The Pantagraph Tuesday, May 4, 2021- More than 100 new cases of COVID-19 were confirmed in McLean County over the weekend and hospital capacity tightened on Monday. OSF and Carle BroMenn medical centers reported 48 COVID patients in their care Monday, a 17 patient jump from Friday's 31 patients. Hospital bed capacity remained tight with both intensive care units bed and all total bed capacity at 96%. McLean County's rolling, seven-day test positivity rate remained below 5%, sitting at 4.2% as of Sunday.
