# Milepost 70 PATIENCE

For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. 1 Cor. 13:12

The Christian life is a journey of faith. What we see in any given season, is a tiny fraction of the complete picture. It's an unfolding process. What the Children of Israel experienced in Egypt and the wilderness, was quite different from the Promised Land. But it was the route they had to take. As the Disciples followed Jesus, their grasp of what it was all about, was limited, and yet it was necessary preparation to be able to continue Jesus' ministry after Pentecost.

I heard a helpful analogy last week, from Steve Stenger. Two architects known for their creative designs 100 years ago, counseled their clients to wait until the last "board" was in place, to assess their creations. They stressed that it won't look right or make sense during the construction process. In fact, if it does look right in the middle of construction, that means effort has been wasted on cosmetics, which will complicate the final result.

MCN is in the early stages of implementing a new way of being church together. As of now, the Vision Team has only 3 of its 5 members. It could be fully functioning by late-July. The Pastoral Team Search Committee could be functioning by early August. The new Commissions and an interim Pastoral Team might be functioning by late August. Why so long? Because discerning the right people for the right roles, takes time. Inviting feedback from the congregation, takes time. And when called by the congregation, individuals need time to discern whether that call matches their inner call.

Transitioning from the old to the new, is complicated, but the structure itself is not. Transitioning from a church on Zoom, to being both in-person and virtual, is also complicated. During July, we will use the after-worship hour, to provide biblical background for the vision priorities and the new structure. It will be in a conversational format, to help all of us to better understand this new way of being church together. Watch for additional information about resuming Christian education options in August or September.

We are both doing well. Long days and challenges, but we still enjoy what we are doing. The work is going well; we finally have permits to begin work on 4 houses, with several more in process. This week we prepared 3 houses to have concrete poured for foundations and slabs.

The devastation and ruin from the fires here are tremendous. So many lots are empty, with driveways leading to a settled spot in the ground. Businesses are gone; some are rebuilding, but many have decided to move away. The place has a strange feel to it, but yet we find pockets of hope and resilience. And many folks we meet are quite interested in what we are doing, and thank us very sincerely. God is at work in this place!

We have enjoyed the weekly volunteers and the things they bring to our project. They have come from Oregon; PA; Sterling, IL; Wisconsin; Ohio; Idaho; Kansas; and New York. We also have long-term volunteers who provide the leadership for the project: Project Director; Office Manager (Wayne); Crew Leaders, (oversight of weekly volunteers); Head Cook; Assistant Cook (Lois); and two Hesston College students who have taken the Disaster Management class. This whole group has worked well together. And Lois is part of a team that has probably prepared the best food I have ever had on an MDS project.
