"God is doing new things, Jesus proclaimed, but only those with new minds and hearts can see a new world breaking through the cracks of the old." -Ilia Delio, The Hours of the Universe

Episcopal priest Stephanie Spellers, in The Church Cracked Open: Disruption, Decline, and New Hope for Beloved Community, sees the current challenges faced by the church and society as a way for God to get through to us. "When you see a crack, what's your first instinct? Push the pieces back together and patch it over." But cracks are often a sign of deeper damage. Perhaps we should put away the duct tape, so we can fully experience the unraveling and brokenness. That may be the only way God can get our attention, so we can open ourselves to the new things of the Spirit.

Alan Roxburgh suggests that the Holy Spirit has been nudging and calling Christians "to embrace a new imagination, but the other one had to unravel for us to see it for what it was" in Joining God, Remaking Church, and Changing the World. Sellers continues: "A church that has been humbled by disruption and decline may be a less arrogant and presumptuous church. It may have fewer illusions about its own power and centrality. It may become curious.... It may finally admit how much it needs the true power and wisdom of the Holy Spirit. That's a church God can work with."

-We have met interesting and gifted people who may not have a lot of building experience but are eager to learn. In spite of high heat, we have gotten a lot accomplished and have made friends with the folks we are building for.

-Cooking for a large group is very demanding, and requires long hours, but is also a chance to bake to my heart's content, as I cannot do for Wayne and me. And all my efforts were much appreciated.
