MORE THAN WE ASK OR IMAGINE!

To God—whose power now at work in us can do immeasurably more than we ask or imagine--to God be glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus, through all the generations, world without end! Amen. Ephesians 3:20-21 (The Inclusive Bible)

There was a common theme throughout the sharing of spiritual gift discernment and small groups experiences, last Sunday after worship. "It was more helpful than I expected." Most of us, most of the time, are creatures of habit, with expectations based on previous experiences, not known for vivid imagination or desire for radical transformation. That describes me well.

In this Sunday's gospel reading (Mark 2:18-22), the disciples of John the Baptist and some Pharisees, had little imagination to see anything positive in Jesus' disciples feasting instead of fasting. All they could see was "this contradicts the way things are supposed to be."

Jesus responded in essence: it depends on the situation. There's a time for feasting, and a time for fasting. Embracing something new does not mean what preceded it was wrong.

In referring to the differences between the civil rights era, and today's antiracism efforts, Reverend Dr. Otis Moss, Jr. commented: "Each generation is limited by what it knows." He called the contemporaries of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., like himself, the Moses generation. Those leading the movement today, are the Joshua generation. Current leaders should learn from the wisdom and experiences of the previous generation, but they should not allow the previous generation to define how they lead today.

It's helpful periodically, to reflect with other Christians, on your current calling. It could result in clarity of call beyond what you imagined, as some shared, because the Holy Spirit is involved.

a Message of Gratitude

July 25 will be Melika Hershberger's last Sunday at MCN for a while. She will be moving to the campus of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (AMBS) in Elkhart, IN on July 31.

"I have sensed God's call to pastoral ministry for many years, but have been unable or unwilling to respond. Over the years many of you have pointed out my gifts for ministry, encouraged the use of my gifts or teased me about when I might take seminary classes. I appreciate your affirmation in it's many forms!

During the pandemic of 2020, while our worship was muted and our fellowship greatly curtailed, God's voice through scripture has been louder for me. My times of scripture reading and prayer, my service to this congregation on pastoral council and Children's Education times on Zoom all carried more weight. My participation in a spiritual gifts discernment small group last fall and my front row seat throughout our transition process has helped me to clarify my passion for the church, God's gifting of me and God's patient, persistent call.

I had very tentatively begun to explore seminary study, thinking it quite unlikely, when God very literally blew a hole in the barriers I believed existed. God provided a way, and as a result I will begin full time seminary study at AMBS this fall. A scholarship I have been awarded by AMBS will permit me to live on campus while not requiring that we sell our house here in Normal. I am very grateful to my family for their unfailing support through the beginning of this adventure. I would ask for your continued prayer support and encouragement as I begin my studies. (It's been a long time since I've been in school!) I don't know where God will ultimately lead me, but I view this as the next step and trust that God's faithful presence will guide me every step of the way."
