WHAT'S WRONG WITH A KING?

Throughout history, when the future was uncertain, or obviously in decline, humans were often willing to embrace authoritarian leadership. In the Prophet Samuel's last years, Israel's future was bleak. The people came to him (1 Samuel 8) saying, "We want a king. That's the only solution to our problems."

Israel in Jesus' day had good reason to be anxious about the future. In John 6, after Jesus fed a crowd of 5,000, with five loaves of bread and two fish, John writes (v.15): *When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.* The King of Kings, refused this populist route to kingship.

Jesus knew the most effective way to lead a movement to usher in God's Reign, was to equip many, so his efforts were multiplied. The role of pastors in Jesus' church, is to equip all believers for ministry (Eph. 4:12), so that ministry grows exponentially.

Like Israel, Mennonites looked at neighboring denominations, and said, "We want what they have—a senior minister with associate ministers. Someone has to be in charge." The hierarchical model makes it difficult to focus on equipping.

The Pastoral Team model in MCN's new structure, has been embraced in many congregations, in recognition of its advantages over a hierarchical model. The Pastoral Team ministry description (available soon), emphasizes the Pastoral Team's priority on equipping. Pastors equip congregants, through a unique combination of gifts: teaching, caring, and leading.

The Pastoral Team Search Committee will search for pastors committed to this equipping focus, applied to the three priorities in MCN's vision to become a faith community that...

- is equipping all to learn about, walk with, and live out the teachings of Jesus in daily life.
- nurtures and nourishes relationships, so that our care and understanding of each other is deepened.
- is developing significant and meaningful relationships through expanding our care for and understanding about/with those beyond MCN.

The Christian Education Committee is proposing the following for Covid-19 Mitigation during Sunday School:

- 1. Wearing of masks by teachers and students

- 3. Parents should alert their child's Sunday school teacher if their child tests positive for Covid-19.
- 4. Sealed snacks will be provided.
- 5. Children will have an assigned, socially-distanced seat in their classroom.

- 7. Mask breaks will be allowed only when socially distanced and while outside or eating.
- 8. Students will be provided with individual beach-sized towels to sit on outside to help define socially-distanced spaces.
