The Christian Education Committee is proposing the following for Covid-19 Mitigation during Sunday School:

- 1. Wearing of masks by teachers and students
- 2. Symptomatic children or teachers should not attend.
- 3. Parents should alert their child's Sunday school teacher if their child tests positive for Covid-19.
- 4. Sealed snacks will be provided.
- 5. Children will have an assigned, socially-distanced seat in their classroom.
- 6. Teachers will be encouraged to teach outside as much as possible, weather permitting.
- 7. Mask breaks will be allowed only when socially distanced and while outside or eating.
- 8. Students will be provided with individual beach-sized towels to sit on outside to help define socially-distanced spaces.

Dear Mennonite Church of Normal,

July 27 marked the 68th anniversary of the signing of the Korean War armistice. The United States and North Korea have yet to sign a peace treaty to officially end the Korean War, and this is one of the root causes of tension and hostilities on the Korean Peninsula. This "forever war" keeps families separated, fuels arms races and risks military conflict.

Motivated by our work in North Korea and our partners in South Korea and the United States, MCC has advocated for many years to end the Korean War. Last year, more than 50 members of Congress voiced support for formally ending the war — but others remain unconvinced.



Take Action



Ask your representative to co-sponsor H.R. 3446, the Peace on the Korean Peninsula Act, which calls for serious, urgent diplomacy in pursuit of a binding peace agreement to formally end the Korean War.
