THE SPIRIT HAS GIVEN EACH OF US A SPECIAL WAY OF SERVING OTHERS

By accepting alternative facts, congregations have missed the profound implications of these 13 words from Paul in 1 Corinthians 12:7. What are some of those alternative facts?

- 1. Pastors are really important, so their gifts are more special. (Something is either special, or not.)
- 2.20% will do 80% of the work—that's universal. (Jesus would disagree.)
- 3. Some people are busier than others. (How is that relevant to Paul's statement? Whether busy or not, one still has a special way of serving others.)
- 4. "I'm not one to get upfront." (Most special ways of serving others, are behind the scenes.)

Can we abandon these alternative facts, and accept that Paul's statement is truth? If so, what are the implications?

- 1. Everyone is needed.
- 2. Each "special way" is different, but none is more valuable than another.
- 3. We need to help each other recognize and embrace our special way of serving others.
- 4. Our individual special ways of serving others, will shape the organizational structure, not vice-versa.
- 5. No one needs to over-function. When some do, they make it difficult for others to use their special way of serving others.

In the last two months, it is encouraging to see some of the above implications becoming reality. A number are saying yes to new calls. Among those who decline, Spiritual Gift Discernment Team often hears, "But this (something else) is my special way of serving others."

The timeline requires that we do the best we can at this point, with calling individuals to serve in the structure. It won't be perfect. Callings can be adjusted, because each year, all groups take time to evaluate how it's going. When Spiritual Gift Discernment Team has completed calling individuals to the Commissions (September), they will shift their focus to helping everyone discern their passion, spiritual gift and calling.

Please remember: Commissions serve as spiritual gift discernment teams in their respective areas. Those with passions and gifts to serve on a specific commission, will be more likely to know who to call to serve in all the ministries of that Commission. Commissions oversee and call. They do not do the ministry which many committees did in the past. Virtually "everyone" will eventually be called through a Commission, to serve in their special way, to accomplish important ministry at MCN.

Flexibility is a key characteristic of the structure. As individuals express their calls, adjustments are made in the structure, so each one can serve others in their special way.
