### **BEFORE AND AFTER**

Would that all the LORD's people were prophets, and that the LORD would put his Spirit on them! Numbers 11:28

Numbers 11 opens with the Children of Israel longing to return to Egypt, where they had all the fish they could eat, along with leeks, melons and cucumbers. Plain manna was getting old. God gets upset at their complaints. Moses takes God's anger personally, and gets upset at God, saying "Don't blame me. I didn't conceive these people—you did."

God says to Moses: delegate; call seventy leaders to help you. God took some of the Spirit from Moses, and distributed it among the seventy. Sound familiar?

The seventy gather in the tent of meeting, and all prophesy. Then several others see two leaders who were prophesying in the camp, not in the tent. They complain to Moses: "They aren't following the rules." Moses replies, "Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, and that the Lord would put his Spirit on them!" This came to pass at Pentecost.

As of today, 32 have been called to various roles in the new structure. By the time Commissions call additional persons to specific ministry roles, you'll have 70+ sharing all of the ministry responsibilities at MCN.

It is encouraging to see the energy and commitment to the new vison, in all of the new groups which are functioning: Vision Team, Spiritual Gift Discernment Team, Pastoral Team Search Committee, Interim Pastoral Team, and Administration and Outreach Commissions. The remaining three Commissions will have first meetings in the next week or two.

Challenging tasks are being addressed. Highlights of the new groups' work, are reported in each Midweek. Thanks to all of the existing committees who continue their ministries, until you are contacted by a new Commission.

#### **Update on Mennonite Church of Normal Finances**

<u>August</u> August Income: \$29,130.85 August Expenses: \$25,471.33 For August: Income - Expenses = \$3,659.52

> Status at the End of August Total income: \$226,650.80 Total expenses: \$238,835.34 Total income - expenses = -\$12,184.54

Two other notes:

- At the end of August we are 2/3, 66.6%, of the way through the year. Income is 57% and expenses are 60% of the total spending plan of \$399,455.
- In July we received gifts from 17 units electronically and from 33 units by envelope. Thank you for your continued support of the Spending Plan.
