IN THE PANDEMIC'S WAKE

Ever been peacefully fishing in a small boat, only to be nearly capsized by the wake of a large boat speeding by? The pandemic has rocked all of us. But this boat keeps circling.

We're all tired of being buffeted by the obvious components of this never-ending wake: overwhelmed health care system and workers, restrictions, inability to make plans for the future, impact on education, separation from loved ones, fear for our own health, and the health of our loved ones, disruption of the supply chain for numerous products, etc. But we can't get out of our boat. We have to keep riding the waves.

There are ripple effects beyond the obvious, which we struggle to even grasp. We keep hearing about the mental health impact on all of us. How is it changing the very fabric of our society? Is it weakening an already broken political system? Is it draining us of energy to deal with catastrophic issues: climate change, structural racism, violence, hunger, homelessness, etc.

If we could consult with many figures in Scripture or Church History, they would say to us: "We've seen this movie before. God is worthy of our trust, and will always be with you."

MCN is a seaworthy vessel these days, prepared for the pandemic's wakes, no matter how long they continue. Enough already have, or will respond with an adventuresome spirit to the all-hands-on-deck call, to work together on new or existing teams. Some need more time. Still others are in healing mode. Let's extend grace freely to everyone in these uncharted waters.

Peter and Paul offer wise counsel for such times, when we can't understand all the nuances of how the pandemic has affected each one of us: Above all, maintain constant love for one another, for love covers a multitude of sin (1 Peter 4:8). Always be humble and gentle. Patiently put up with each other and love each other (Ephesians 4:2).
