### Administration Commission Update

Financial work in progress includes:

- ·Separating financial duties.
- ·Updating the 2022 Spending Plan.

Building matters in progress include:

- ·Installation of a third telephone line.
- ·Changing our telephone plan to a cheaper plan.
- Installation of a new firebox as the old one wasn't functioning well.
- ·Exploring blinds and windows as a number of blinds are broken and need to be replaced. Policies are being reviewed, drafted, and updated, especially as related to the building and outside events. An additional policy on copyrighted materials (music, pictures, books) used during livestreaming has been developed and communicated with the Worship Commission. We're in the process of reviewing employee Memoranda of Understanding and job descriptions. These will be updated shortly for 2022.

### Community Life Commission

The Community Life Commission has established a philosophy statement which follows. The Community Life Commission supports our Church Mission, Vision, and Anabaptist Theology. We approach our ministry by valuing wholeness and nurture relationship building using grace and demonstrating the love of Christ.

To assist this commission in working toward meeting the second goal of the Congregational Vision Statement by 2024, we have established two committees to begin to move forward. The goal is: By 2024 we will be a dynamic faith community that nurtures and nourishes relationships, so that our care and understanding of each other is deepened. These committees are the Congregational Care Committee (formerly Pastoral Council) and the Fellowship Committee. We now have full membership on the Congregational Care Committee and are hoping to have the openings on the Fellowship Committee filled soon.
