Update from Clara

It was such a wonderful time with my family here visiting between Christmas and New Year's! It was so great to see them get to meet my host family, visit my house, and get to see the city that I live in. I can't believe that my year with SALT is about half over, the time has absolutely flown by!

The biggest highlight for me during the Christmas/Advent Season was probably seeing how the city was completely transformed with Christmas lights and decorations starting in the beginning of December. Every park was completely filled with lights, and we had several fun family outings going to look at Christmas lights. They even decorated many of the city buses with LED lights! Another highlight was the Christmas celebration at our church. We celebrated with a lunch, raffle, and bingo.

In the beginning of February, we will receive the interns that will work with us for the upcoming semester. Creciendo Juntos relies on the help of interns to keep our activities rolling, so it will be exciting to meet them and begin working again. Colombia operates on a school schedule opposite of that of the US, it is similar to preparing for a new school year. Next week, we will begin the process of registration for the upcoming year. I am really hoping that we are able to spread the word about the registration so that we are able to include more children in our activities.

Because my host family has been on vacation the past few weeks from work and school, we have been able to do several things together, which has been a great way to build relationships. On Monday, I went with two of my siblings and two cousins on a four-hour bike ride throughout the city. This was a great time for me to get to know the city a bit better and hear about some of the city's history from my host cousin.

One way to be praying right now would be that lots of new children will be able to register into our program for this upcoming year and that we are able to start off strong with activities. In the next coming months, I am expecting there to be some challenges at work with organizing all of our materials and preparing for activities.

Colombia is being hit pretty hard right now with Covid with higher numbers than we have seen in a long time. The city has been overwhelmed with a need for tests, and we do not really have access to the at-home rapid type tests that are available at drug stores in the US. Fortunately, my host family and I have been able to avoid Covid thus far, and were fortunate to have the chance to receive Covid boosters.

The best way that the church could be praying in 2022 would be for continued energy for my work and relationship building with the children and families at work, and safety during times of high Covid numbers. Thanks!!
