We had a productive meeting discussing several questions raised by members of the congregation. These included encouraging preachers & other worship leaders to be unmasked unless they have a personal preference to stay masked; returning soon to receiving the offering during worship, offering the Memorial gift Hymnals for worship use; affirmation of changes in the liturgy for Lent; logistics for how communion is served; & accessibility strategies related to those with visual & hearing impairment. We began Maundy Thursday Tenebrae worship planning & reviewed plans for Palm Sunday & Easter. We looked ahead to some initiatives to pursue after Easter. If you have worship questions or comments to enhance meaningful worship for our whole congregation, please let us know.

Vision Team Update

The Vision Team met on Wednesday, March 9. Following the meeting, Vision Team has the following items to share with the congregation:

- 1. Vision Team received regular reports on the current activities of the Spiritual Gifts Discernment Team (SGDT), Pastoral Team Search Committee (PTSC), the Interim Pastoral Team (IPT), and the Commissions and discussed where support is needed.
- 2. Vision Team discussed potential names to fill the vacant role of SGDT Chair.
- 3. Vision Team discussed the ownership and development of personnel policies and practices that would be used for the long-term Pastoral Team.

World Conference - Indonesia 2022

The Executive Committee has opted for limited on-site attendees and many options for online attendees at the hybrid Assembly 17. MWC Assembly is hosted by the three Indonesian Anabaptist-Mennonite synods in Central Java, Indonesia, 5-10 July 2022.

MWC Assembly 17 in Indonesia will welcome 700 on-site participants with the option of additional Indonesian guests for opening night and closing service. Due to COVID-19 regulations, 700 is the number currently possible.

Registration for online participation opened in December 2021. Registration for on-site Assembly opened yesterday. More information here.

From the Discipling Commission

Beginning on April 3rd, there will be two new options for Adult Christian Education following Worship.

Peaceful Practices, **Adult CE Class for April and May facilitated by Phil Dick**: This class includes 9 sessions organized by Mennonite Central Committee (MCC). To help people learn to work through divisive issues, MCC U.S. has produced a new curriculum, *Peaceful Practices: A Guide to Healthy Communication in Conflict*. It invites churchgoers to follow Jesus' call to peacemaking through dialogue with each other. More information can be found here. From Clara Unzicker, serving with Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) in Bogota, Colombia

I continue to be really busy at work, which I'm thankful for. We have a group of four social work interns and four teaching interns who help us throughout the week—I really don't know what we would do without their help.

We have many Venezuelan kids who have joined our program this year—almost 60 (out of 230ish total). It seems like overall the Colombian children can connect and share spaces with Venezuelan children better than the adults can.

I continue to develop relationships with my host family and enjoy spending time with them. We went out for pizza last Tuesday to celebrate International Women's Day. I find it interesting that International Women's Day is such a huge event here compared to the US.

I enjoyed a visit from one of my close friends from Goshen College last week, and it was nice to have a week off from work and stay somewhere else for a week. Having a bit of space from work and my host family helped to re-energize me a bit.

I am currently in conversation with MCC about some of the last details, but I am going to be extending my MCC term here until the end of the year (instead of leaving in July). I have felt really connected to the work that I have been doing at Creciendo Juntos and felt that I should explore opportunities to continue this longer than the original time, so I am really glad that I will be able to stay a little longer.
