The Prayer that Jesus Taught

Throughout Lent, we have been praying the prayer that Jesus taught in Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2-4, commonly known as "The Lord's Prayer" or the "Our Father." This prayer has been used in Christian worship since ancient times and is the one prayer that is shared across all Christian traditions. It is considered by many to be the perfect lesson in how to pray. As Jesus said, "Your Father knows what you need before you ask him. Pray then in this way." Thousands of writers have written commentaries on this core prayer and you could probably spend your life mining its depths.

Voices Together provides six versions of the prayer at #989, including three in English. Starting April 24, one version of the prayer in English plus the French version will be projected on Sunday mornings. It may vary from week to week, as decided by the worship planner. If the version on the screen is unfamiliar, use this as an opportunity to reflect on the different emphases in the translation. May praying using Jesus' words be an enriching experience for all of us.

Pastoral Jean Search Committee

"Where have all the pastors gone?" That's a clever title for a recent Hesston College conference, but a sadly, a true question. Lauren Satchwell and Lynette Miller attended online. Last week Lauren briefed the search committee. Before you read a summary of her comments to us, think of the Mary Poppins song, "Just a spoonful of sugar helps the medicine go down," and take a spoonful of sugar. What follows is a bitter pill. Across the country and across denominations there is a shortage of pastors.

Here are a few reasons. The demands of the job often don't leave enough time for family and life beyond the church. Churches expect pastors to have all the answers to all their problems. In some congregations there is a multi-generational clash about expectations for a pastor and what the church is supposed to be. Churches can chew up a pastor. People exit the ministry or decide to serve in other capacities.

What solution have some churches adopted to the pastoral shortage? *Discipleship*. Look within the congregation for pastoral leadership. Lauren asked us to look at what Jesus' model teaches us. MCN is embracing that model. Weekly, we read about discipleship in the Midweek, hear about discipleship on Sunday morning and see examples of hard-working disciples all around us.

How do we attract pastors and others to our church? People come through our *Front Door!* What does that mean? The new front door is our online presence. The committee is taking that suggestion seriously. In the coming weeks we will report about one idea we have to invite others online to enter through our new Front Door.

Finally, not from Lauren's report, but in answer to the question why some CDC churches have just hired new pastors and we have not. Those newly hired pastors made choices based on location and family! They never were in our candidate pool. Before you read further, take another spoonful of sugar. One of those churches that just hired a new pastor waited for two years.

We keep searching and give thanks for those among us who keep discipling.
