This Sunday we will consider the critical place of trees in the ecosystems of God's creation and for restoring the Earth.

Steve Thomas will be preaching the sermon, *Trees of Life to Restore God's Earth* using scriptures Genesis 2:4b-9.

Steve Thomas has served as a Mennonite pastor for 33 years. He is the director of Mennonite Men, the men's organization for MCUSA. He is also the coordinator of JoinTrees, a Mennonite campaign to plant one million trees to help restore the Earth. Steve is a certified arborist and has a graduate certificate in urban forestry from Oregon State University. He lives at Pathways Retreat, a spiritual retreat center in Goshen, Indiana where he's planted 3,000 trees. He and his wife Linda Lehman Thomas have four children and one granddaughter.

Vision Jean Update

The Vision Team met on Wednesday, May 4. Following the meeting, Vision Team has the following items to share with the congregation:

- 1. Vision Team received regular reports on the current activities of the Spiritual Gifts Discernment Team (SGDT), Pastoral Team Search Committee (PTSC), the Interim Pastoral Team (IPT), and the Commissions and discussed where support is needed.
- 2. Vision Team finalized its plans and timeline to facilitate discussion and feedback from the congregation. Starting Sunday, May 8, a member of the Vision Team will be present for Vision Team "Office Hours" after the worship hour. - 3. Vision Team hosted a joint meeting with the chairs of the Commissions on Monday, May 9. This meeting featured a fruitful discussion including the berth of ideas for how Commissions could better collaborate and work together.
- 4. The Vision Team members shared feedback with each other as part of its quarterly self-evaluation exercise.
- 5. Find Vision Team meeting minutes and resource documents in the <u>Vision Team folder on Google</u> <u>Drive</u>.

Administration Commission Update

We continue to be busy with a range of topics. Here's a short update. We plan to share a much larger update in June when we have more complete information on a variety of items.

• We had the building inspected. One of the things that we learned was that we have high humidity. We worked with our HVAC company on several possible solutions. Then, we discovered the vents into the building from the original air conditioning system had not been filled. Those two vents have now been filled with rock and cement. The humidity in the building has dropped significantly, about 20-25%.

• Office technology problems have included unreceived emails, lost phone messages, and a constantly ringing telephone. We are in the process of restoring the system to functionality. We appreciate your patience as we would like to serve you better than the system was allowing us to do.

• We've replaced the firebox as it was malfunctioning.

- The kitchen sink drain was raining water due to corrosion. This has been replaced.
- We have found delegates for the MC USA conference in May in Kansas City.
- We have several delegates for Central District Conference in Goshen in June.
- Lydia Hedberg will be starting as Office Administrator on May 16. We are in the process of planning her orientation.

• Rita Munkakusi is providing temporary custodial services until we're able to hire a permanent custodian.

- Roger Clemens and John Reimer are mowing the church yard this summer.
- Administration Commission is opening and closing the building.
