## Update from Clara Unzicker, SALT in Bogota Colombia

I've been continuing to stay busy at work for the past month or so. We're finishing up the semester with our interns and daily activities. We are working with about 125 children each week, having workshops and activities focusing on the family. In the past few weeks, we have looked at the different types of families, roles in a family, and how to navigate conflict within the family. This weekend we will be hosting a late Mother's Day celebration with lunch and special activities. We are also heading into our last week of registration for our "Soccer Tournament for Peace," an annual event that is held at Creciendo Juntos each summer. Partnering with another Mennonite organization called JustaPaz, we are planning workshops, soccer practices, and games for 100 kids ages 6-17. JustaPaz will lead workshops on peace and nonviolence, teamwork, and conflict resolution as applied to soccer and other situations. The kids are getting excited about the tournament and I'm looking forward to being able to watch them play. When I arrived at Creciendo Juntos last September I was able to watch the final of the tournament, so I'm really looking forward to being able to participate from start to finish.

We are also continuing to see several challenging situations at work with several migrant families that have arrived from Venezuela in the past months. There are several families with four or five children who have arrived in the neighborhood. We have been working hard to collect local donations and resources to help support these families who are struggling to gain footing here in Colombia and don't have the resources to buy things for the home or food for the children to eat. I would ask for prayers for these families and also for Creciendo Juntos to be able to locate resources to help their transition to living in Colombia a little easier. I was able to enjoy an MCC retreat two weeks ago with the Colombia-Ecuador team where we were able to spend several days together. I'm very thankful for this time. Thanks for all of the thoughts, prayers, and kind words...it is all really appreciated! -Clara
