


This is what we have so far:

- "Serious Saturday", August 6, the candidate meets with the Vision Team and other congregational leaders to discuss the serious business of pastoring us. We are working out the many essential elements of that day while trying not to leave the candidate too weak to preach on Sunday.
- **Sunday, August 7**, the pastoral candidate gives the sermon. A picnic lunch for all follows.
- Sunday, August 14, members of the congregation vote on the candidate.

Worship Notes from the Worship Commission

At our recent meeting we continued discussion of the need for a paid accompanist for the choirs when they resume as well as possible musicians to add to the worship accompanist schedule. We finalized a Tip Sheet for Communion Leaders, Preparers, & Servers; a Tip Sheet for Guest Preachers; and our Worship Philosophy which will be sent to the Vision Team. We discussed logistics for Communion given Covid restrictions; the possibility of using one of several lectionaries to guide preaching until we have a settled pastor. We will share the information with the Interim Pastoral Team, which plans the preaching schedule now, for their input; & whether we should hold a worship at the church building on the retreat Sunday at Menno Haven. It seemed to late to plan for this year, but we will consider it next year. Thanks to our many members who share their gifts in worship each Sunday!


