# About Kevin Chupps

### About the Candidate & Summary of the Interviews with Pastoral Team Search Committee and Vision Team:

Kevin Chupp is currently the pastor of First Mennonite Church of Aberdeen, Idaho, in the southeast corner of Idaho. Kevin is the solo pastor and the position is full-time. He has served in that role since August 2016. Kevin is involved in Mennonite Church USA, serving as the Moderator for the Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference.

He and his wife, Jess, have one daughter, Junia, who is almost two. Kevin grew up in Indiana, in a fellow Anabaptist denomination, the Missionary Church.

Kevin's formal education is as follows; his undergraduate work was completed at Bethel University, in Mishawaka, IN. He completed one year of seminary at the Quaker Seminary, Portland Seminary in Portland, OR. Then he transferred to Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary in Elkhart, IN and graduated with a Masters of Divinity in 2020. He is currently working on a certificate in LGBTQ Leadership from the University of Redlands, in Redlands, CA. As one his references summarized, "Kevin gained a broad theological background... out of that background he has very knowledgeably chosen to be a part of an Anabaptist peace tradition and very purposefully chosen to serve God within the Mennonite Church."

The thoughtful responses we read in his Ministerial Leadership Information form were consistent with who we found Kevin to be during the four hours (over two separate sessions) of interviewing over Zoom. All references provided written statements. We spoke with each reference at length. All comments were highly favorable. As one reference said, "He's a wonderful pastor and a great human being."

With this, the Pastoral Team Search Committee unanimously agreed to recommend Kevin Chupp to the Vision Team as a pastoral candidate for Mennonite Church of Normal. Kevin flew to Normal at the end of June, for a two-day fast-paced in-person visit with members of the PTSC and VT. *continued on p. 3* 

#### In the words of members of the PTSC, this is what we have to say about Kevin:

"I've found him to be a well-rounded individual who would make an excellent pastor. His commitment to Anabaptism and the Mennonite Church is clear. He has a good understanding of his own strengths as well as when he needs to seek help from others or simply give space to let God do His work. His theological beliefs and leadership style appear to be well-aligIned with the Mennonite Church of Normal. I've found Kevin to be easy to relate to and someone who will walk along with us as we continue on our faith journey. I see a number of strengths in Kevin, and I am confident that these strengths would allow him to be successful as part of a team of pastors here at the Mennonite Church of Normal."

"I was so strongly encouraged when his reference said 'I want him to be my pastor.""

"Words that kept coming up or appearing when speaking with Kevin or his references were: non-anxious, solid character, collaborator, nurturer, life-long learner. Additionally, it became clear to me that not only would Kevin be a great fit for Mennonite Church of Normal, but our church community could be a great place for Kevin, Jess, and Junia."

We are very excited to introduce Kevin and his family to you on August 6th and 7th. May we all continue to pray and discern.

# Pastoral Cardidate Voting

Based on the Pastoral Team Search Committee and the Vision Team's recommendation of pastoral candidate Kevin Chupp, the Mennonite Church of Normal (MCN) is encouraged to vote regarding an invitation for Kevin Chupp to join MCN's Pastoral Team full time. **The vote is planned to begin on August 7 at 12:30 PM**, after the Q&A Session.

A link to online voting will be sent by email when voting opens and will also be in the 8/3 Midweek. Votes will be accepted until 12:00 noon on Friday, August 12. Paper ballots will be available at the church. If you need a paper ballot mailed to your home, please submit a request to the office no later than Friday, August 5. Completed ballots mailed to the church must be postmarked by August 9. All are eligible to vote. Members and associate members will be filed as a voting quorum. Non-members are invited to vote as both voting totals will be captured and reported in tandem. Any questions can be directed to the Vision Team.

The Discipling Commission has been working prayerfully to discern a new focus and structure for adult Christian Education at MCN. Our desire is that relationships will be fostered and strengthened as we learn together what it means to follow Jesus from an Anabaptist perspective.


Starting this fall, we will be convening three age-based "Journey Groups" that will meet during the CE hour. Journey Group A will be for those in their 20s and 30s, Journey Group B, for 40s and 50s, and Journey Group C, for those 60 and above. Individuals whose age falls close to the cutoff between groups may choose to participate in the Journey Group above or below their age if they desire (for example, a 38-or 39-year old may choose to join Journey Group B, which begins at 40). Age groupings may be modified as we move through the year and determine what works best.

This coming year, Journey Groups will be discussing books that align with the following topics: Christian Living, Peace and Justice, Scripture/Biblical study, and Hospitality.

### Welcome Heartland Head Start!

The Administration Commission announces that Heartland Head Start will be returning to the Mennonite Church of Normal this fall. Head Start's goal is to begin classes sometime in September. Historically, MCN has hosted Heartland Head Start in our building for over 30 years, serving over 1,000 children and families.

Head Start works to "help break the cycle of poverty by providing preschool children of low-income families with a comprehensive program to meet all of their physical and mental needs." In the past several years, Heartland Head Start has expanded their mission to include a comprehensive child and family development program for women receiving prenatal care, children ages birth to 5 years old and their families. MCN's site will host two part-day sessions of 17 preschool age children each, Monday through Thursday. This site in particular allows children with special needs to take part in Unit 5 services.

Heartland Head Start's new Executive Director approached MCN this past spring. The Administration Commission talked with Vision Team, who affirmed that working with Head Start aligns with the church's vision. Before entering discussions with Head Start, the Administration Commission then held a hearing with church members to hear feedback and gain support towards bringing Heartland Head Start back to MCN.

Negotiations with Head Start have taken some time as the Administration Commission wanted to ensure MCN's building and facilities are used and treated well. The Administration Commission then consulted an attorney to prepare a legal 10-month lease agreement that included details reflecting past experiences such as the outdoor play area, transportation, kitchen use, storage, as well as reimbursement for services, ongoing maintenance, and supplies. Heartland Head Start will prepare snacks and meals off site and bring them to the church to have minimal use of MCN's kitchen. Heartland Head Start will keep their storage in the classroom provided for their use.

The existing playground does not meet the Department of Children and Family Services' requirements. Head Start is unable to use the existing playground. Therefore, the Campus Use Plan the church approved in 2013 will be followed that has the play area located outside the northwest corner of the building. Heartland Head Start will install a play area after the Administration Commission approves their specific plans. This will include a short, four-foot, solid, vinyl fence in an almond color to match the siding on the church building. The gates to the playground area will always be locked, but there will be access for church events. Play equipment will not be tall enough to be seen over the short four-foot fence.

The return of Heartland Head Start to the Mennonite Church of Normal supports the congregational Vision. As a start date is identified, more information and further updates will be provided at that time.




