This Sunday we will study and reexamine what we know about these women, about ourselves, and together we will trust the Lord to open our eyes and lead us to living water to nourish our souls.

Delegate Report: Mining Central District Conference Annual Meeting

Ron Ropp and I (Barry Weaver) served as delegates to the annual meeting of the Central District Conference (CDC) of Mennonite Church USA (MC USA) June 23-25. (First time for me.) Our church belongs to this conference as well as Illinois Mennonite Conference. The theme of the meeting was "Tending Transformation." This was expressed in many ways.

It became clear to me that these 46 congregations have thoughtfully chosen to come together to, "Promote a Christ-like community of hospitality where patience and generosity are practiced; call and nurture compassionate Anabaptist leadership; and support missional partnerships that foster ministries of evangelism, peace, healing and hope." (CDC Mission Statement, abridged)

One of the ways that these goals are being put into practice is through the \$350,000 Tending Transformation Campaign. This recently launched fund will underwrite the soon-to-be-hired associate conference minister, create an Emerging Communities of Faith grant, support missional activities, and support pastor leadership development. \$200,000 of this has already been raised during the "quiet" phase of the campaign!

Everything about the gathering—formal, informal, and spontaneous—appeared to align with the goals expressed in the Mission Statement. This invigorated and inspired me. Talk to Ron or me if you want to hear more!

Sunday, August 14, 2022 **Escape to Camp Menno Haven**


Worship: 10:00 am

Campus tours will be offered at Maple Lawn Campus beginning at 12:30: Maple Lawn Cottages, Social Center, Trail among the trees, The Loft.


