Your Vision Team met on September 21, 2022. Following the meeting, Vision Team has the following items to share with the congregation:

- 1. Vision Team received reports on the activities of the Spiritual Gifts Discernment Team (SGDT), Pastoral Team Search Committee (PTSC), the Interim Pastoral Team (IPT), and the Commissions and identified ways we can support them. Members of Vision Team checked in with the leaders of the Teams and Commissions. Valuable input was shared from these conversations.
- 2.We continued preparations for Pastor Kevin Chupp to become part of our Pastoral Team starting October 23. Lauren Satchwell will lead the planning of our welcoming activities for the Chupp family.
- 3.We continued to develop the Vision Team portion of the 2023 Congregational Spending Plan (pastors' wages and benefits).
- 4. We began plans for conducting a church-wide evaluation of the church structure approximately one year after its implementation. Additional details will be shared as they become available.

I Go On Singing: Paul Robeson's Life in Word and Song

Saturday, Oct. 8, 2022, 7pm

Saturday 10/8, the gifted American baritone and international ambassador of peace Anthony Brown will perform "I Go on Singing: Paul Robeson's Life in Word and Song". "I Go On Singing" tells the story of Paul Robeson, an All-American athlete, scholar, international recording artist and star of the stage and screen. In his day, Robeson was the most famous African American entertainer of the world. His life was a courageous example of integrity and discipline in the service of human rights.

Accompanied by a pianist, narrator and archival video, Anthony Brown reveals Robeson as a towering figure in American history and a champion for peace and human rights for much of the 20th century. The story of this American hero who struggled and triumphed comes alive in a rousing 75 minute song filled multimedia presentation. This performance brings music and history alive with equal parts documentary and live concert experience. Musical numbers range from Spirituals to Broadway and includes Robeson's original arrangements of favorites like "Wade the Water", "O'l Man River", "It Ain't Necessarily So", "Water Boy" and many others.


MCC: Young Adult Peace Camps
