

News from the Virginia Mennonite Conference



Maria Bears Statement



As the Mama Bears group of MCN, it pains us to read of the marginalization and violence done to our dear LGBTQIA Christians by the Virginia Mennonite Conference leaders. We want to bring to light the harm that the opposition causes members of our own congregation as well as within the larger Mennonite community. The Resolution for Repentance and Transformation, which was adopted at the 2022 Special Session of the Delegate Assembly of the Mennonite Church USA, can be read here. Reading the actual resolution is an opportunity for us to listen to those who have been harmed, to acknowledge their God-given gifts, and to heal us as a denomination. I Go On Singing: Paul Robeson's Life in Word and Song

Saturday 10/8, the gifted American baritone and international ambassador of peace Anthony Brown will perform "I Go on Singing: Paul Robeson's Life in Word and Song". "I Go On Singing" tells the story of Paul Robeson, an All-American athlete, scholar, international recording artist and star of the stage and screen. In his day, Robeson was the most famous African American entertainer of the world. His life was a courageous example of integrity and discipline in the service of human rights.

Accompanied by a pianist, narrator and archival video, Anthony Brown reveals Robeson as a towering figure in American history and a champion for peace and human rights for much of the 20th century. The story of this American hero who struggled and triumphed comes alive in a rousing 75 minute song filled multimedia presentation. This performance brings music and history alive with equal parts documentary and live concert experience. Musical numbers range from Spirituals to Broadway and includes Robeson's original arrangements of favorites like "Wade the Water", "O'l Man River", "It Ain't Necessarily So", "Water Boy" and many others.

Responding to the hunger crisis in South Sudan

"If I did not get registered for this food, my children would have died of hunger." This is the stark reality that Nyarwot Bim Chan is facing in South Sudan today. A mother of five at 28, Chan's options to provide for her family are devastatingly limited. Near-constant conflict across the country for the last three decades has had a drastic effect on the South Sudanese people: 18% of the population are internally displaced and 63% don't have sufficient and safe access to food. But thanks to the support of MCC donors, in the midst of this crisis, Chan and her family are not entirely without hope. Read the Mennonite Central Committee story here.
