When I was four years old, my family moved from Michigan to Indiana, and I vividly remember that my entire contribution was placing a little plastic suitcase of toy cars on my closet shelf before going outside to get a Bugs Bunny ice cream from the ice cream truck. Our recent move from Idaho to Illinois was a much different story! Besides moving all our stuff, we are learning a new community, and church. My sabbath day has migrated from Mondays to Fridays, and it didn't take long to realize that the shift from terms like "board," "deacon," and "council" to terms like "commission" and "Vision Team" is more than just semantic. I have been feeling my way around this church structure through formal and informal meetings, and I'm starting to see a fuller picture.

LGBTQ Supportive Church Suspended from Conference

Jubilee Mennonite Church in Winnipeg, Manitoba is a welcoming church who affirms "'all people are made in the image of God and are equally loved by God,' and that everyone is welcome to join 'regardless of gender identity, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, social or economic status or ability." As well, "through membership, everyone is welcome to participate in the full life of the church, including communion, baptism and marriage." Due to this welcoming stance, the Mennonite Brethren Church of Manitoba conference has suspended Jubilee Mennonite Church from the conference as the conference holds that marriage is between a man and a woman only.
