

## Civil Rights Trip

#### April 13-21, 2023

Normal 1st United Methodist Church is planning a Civil Rights trip on April 13 – 21, 2023. They will be visiting important Civil Rights sites in Birmingham, Montgomery, Selma, Tuskegee, and Memphis. They will be travelling on a 27-passenger bus through Timi's tours. The total cost of the trip is \$1700, of which \$1300 is due by January 15th. Currently, there are 17 people signed up, with a few more still considering the trip, and there is still room for a few more people.

The group has just begun meeting to prepare for the trip. This includes learning about each site that they'll be visiting as well as discussing chapters from the book *The 1619 Project*. The meetings have been very helpful also in terms of getting to know one another. The intent is for this whole experience to not only gain knowledge, but to also increase our understanding of our country's history that continues to impact our society still today. # Hesston students protest college's handling of sexual assault reports



About 60 Hesston College students walked out of Formation (chapel) on Dec. 2 to protest what student leaders described as an unsafe campus where college staff minimized or ignored reports of sexual assault. They walked from Hesston Mennonite Church to the "Community Healing Circle," a new monument south of the Administration Building, where four students spoke to a crowd of about 90 people, mostly students. Two students told of being sexually assaulted. Student leaders presented a list of 12 demands, urging college officials to hold perpetrators accountable, support survivors, hire additional staff and train existing staff to listen sympathetically and respond appropriately.
