
Narrative Lectionary

Community Life Commission Update for January 2023

Community Life Commission (CLC) met for a four-hour long retreat in November. A review of the past 15 months was presented, and discussion focused on establishing three main goals for 2023. These goals will assist the Mennonite Church of Normal in reaching Vision Goal number two specifically. The commission submitted the annual report for 2022 and a proposed 2023 budget for the Commission which included the Fellowship Committee and Congregational Care Committee. Other commission business centers around welcoming and showing hospitality to all individuals attending MCN. A welcome brochure is being developed by the commission to be available to new attendees.

The fellowship Committee welcomed Pam and Meredith to the committee late in the fall of 2022. In October the Committee represented by Mary Ann assisted in hosting a welcome meal for Pastor Chupp and family following his ordination. Monthly activities in December included a cookie bake, Christmas Caroling, and serving coffee and cookies on Christmas morning following worship service. Coffee service throughout the year continues with Marianne coordinating. January activities include planning and serving the Annual Meeting meal, a meal for Sue family and friends, and the Friedenswald retreat. The retreat is being planned by Darvis and Shelly. Looking ahead to February, planning is under way for a cupcake decorating event on February 8 for all. Also, on that same night information/a discussion focused on the future of Mennonite Women at MCN will be held.

Congregational Care Committee (CCC) will start the new year with a retreat on January 14th at the church. Steve and Keith have ended their term and Becky will step into the Chairperson role for the committee starting this month. The committee is welcoming Pastor Chupp who will now be joining the committee for monthly meetings. Ron brings the committee up to date with news from the Visitation team each month.

As you can see, we are a busy group in our attempt to support MCNs mission, vision, and anabaptist theology by nurturing relationships and demonstrating the love of Christ.

An Invitation to be Heard

The CDC Leadership Council met at Camp Friedenswald on October 29. One agenda item included responding to the question, "How shall CDC live into the resolution on Repentance and Transformation?" which was passed by MC USA delegates in May. Many ideas were generated. One thing that was clear is that CDC leadership is called to listen to the stories of those who have experienced harm by the church or whose gifts have not been welcomed in the church because of their sexual identity or the sexual identity of a family member.

The CDC ministerial committee encourages anyone or any congregation who would like to begin a conversation to contact either Koontz, ministerial committee chairperson, or Conference Minister Luginbill (contact information below). The members of the ministerial committee and their responsibilities can be found here. We want to listen well. We want to tend transformation in our conference. We long for healing and hope.

When someone contacts a member of the committee, the following questions will be asked:

- How would you like to share your story? In writing? Meeting in person with someone?
 Meeting over Zoom? Other?
- With whom would you like to share your story? Conference minister? Member of ministerial committee? With someone else?
- Would you like to invite a support person to be with you when you share your story?
- What would you hope for by telling your story?
- Is there anything else you would like us to know before we hear your story?
- Stories that the ministerial committee hears will not be shared except with permission by the story teller.

The soft-spoken preacher



Congregants deliver sermons written by pastor who lost her voice to COVID. Monica Miller found her voice in her first pastorate not behind the pulpit, but in the pews. Believing the worst of a case of long COVID was behind her, Miller was hired in November 2021 as pastor of First Mennonite Church in Indianapolis. The virus had targeted her diaphragm nearly a year earlier in such a way that breathing was difficult and speaking impossible. "Progress before this summer was excruciatingly slow, but it was very steady with few ups and downs," she said via keyboard in an online

messaging conversation. "Then this June, for no reason we've been able to discern, I went a million miles backward in the span of a week. Confined to bed. Unable to talk." The congregation has supported her in a host of ways, perhaps most intriguingly with a group of five women and two men who have been preaching the sermons she writes.
