
# THE MID WEEK




# Congregational Meal Sign-Up

# Schrag, who led Mennonite denominational merger, dies at 78

James F. Schrag, 78, a denominational administrator and pastor who led the merger that created Mennonite Church USA, died Jan. 7 in North Newton, Kan. His efforts to unify Mennonites from two historical streams emerged during years as a pastor. A longtime advocate of cooperation and unity among Mennonites of different traditions, Schrag was the first executive director of MC USA, serving from 2001 to 2009. The denominational appointment emerged from Schrag's role as project leader for the team that guided the final two years of the merger process, beginning in 1999. For three years before that, he was general secretary of the General Conference Mennonite Church, which joined with the Mennonite Church to form the new denomination.
