Pastoral Jean at CDC

On Saturday, a couple of us from the Pastoral Team (Ron Ropp and I) traveled to attend the Central District Conference (CDC) hybrid mid-year gathering at First Mennonite Church of Champaign-Urbana. We spent time worshipping and reflecting together, and processing things happening at the conference and denominational level.

One of the items was conversation about how we as a conference are living into the Repentance & Transformation resolution that was recently passed by delegates in May. One very tangible response is the "Queer Mennonite Visioning Retreat," happening March 16-19 at Camp Friedenswald, which is offered at no cost to LGBTQIA+ and allied Mennonites, due to deep discounts from the camp, and CDC's commitment for the rest of the cost.

We also became acquainted with Matt Pritchard, the new Associate Conference Minister of Emerging Communities of Faith. He shared about his previous and current work settings, told us about CDC's plans and goals for his work, and guided us in a discussion surrounding how we hope people feel when they join our communities.

Beyond all of the "official" parts of the meeting, it was a blessing to simply share conversation and hear common themes emerge from communities outside of our own. The conversation was rich, the energy was encouraging, and I am grateful that we made the trip. I am also glad to share with all of you that I (Kevin) have accepted the invitation to serve on CDC's Ministerial Committee. Aside from the good work that calls for, I am excited to cultivate strong connections with our conference as they serve and equip us as we work toward faithfulness in a time like this.

Youth Ministry Update

Below is an update on youth ministry and activities here at MCN. Providing support and programming for our youth is a topic that the Discipling Commission discusses regularly in our meetings, as we continue to retool our MYF and JMYF programs. Here's a quick recap:

As part of our congregational restructuring, the Youth Ministry Committee was dissolved, and these responsibilities now fall under the Discipling Commission. Shannon Unzicker, who formerly served on the YMC, joined the Discipling Commission as co-chair, along with Spring Neely.

Shelly and Darvis King are our JMYF Sponsors, but we continued to be unable to find MYF Sponsors. Lauren Satchwell generously fills in as needed. Operating under COVID restrictions of course proves quite challenging. Once we were able to be in the building again, Discipling Commission focused on providing ways for youth to get re-acquainted and socialize.

2022-2023

We were/are still without MYF sponsors, and struggling with COVID challenges, as MCN went back to gathering remotely again for a number of weeks in early 2022. In May we held a cookie and punch reception for our two high school graduates. As in past years, we took a summer break and resumed youth group activities again in the fall. The Kings continue as JMYF sponsors, and Shannon Unzicker agreed to coordinate MYF activities until sponsors can be found. A cookout was held at the Unzickers in October for both groups (JMYF and MYF) and in November a number of youth helped with Family Fun Night activities at the church. In December the MYF met at MCN for a meal with Pastor Kevin and his family before joining the church-wide caroling night. In late 2022, the Spring Neely proposed (and DC recommended) that a Youth Ministry sub-committee be formed in order to create and implement a regular meeting schedule for both youth groups. Pastor Kevin, Shannon Unzicker and the Kings met to start working on ideas for activities through May 2023.

On February 8th, both MYF and JMYF met at church for a meal together with Pastor Kevin, Shannon Unzicker, and the Kings before joining others for the cupcake-decorating night hosted by the CLC. Both groups are planning on gathering again this month to bake and package items for the Relief Sale. Plans are in the works for at least one activity per month for the rest of the school year.

Where we're headed:

In April, Shannon Unzicker, Spring Neely, and Pastor Kevin will be holding a meeting for parents of 6-12 graders during the CE hour to talk more about youth programming at MCN. DC would like establish a schedule to provide 3-4 youth group activities per month, such as service opportunities, regular Bible studies, and gathering for fun and fellowship. Without a doubt, we will need the support and assistance of parents and the wider congregation to make such a program function.

After we have met with parents and talked further, DC will be sharing our plans and ideas with the wider congregation, and hope to raise awareness of the help that will be needed to get a consistent program up and running. 
