

Propaganda, lies, and the rights of civilians in war times

Below is an excerpt from Kathy Kern's article for Community Peacemaker Teams titled "Propaganda, lies, and the rights of civilians in war times."

When Hamas fighters began their invasion of Israeli communities near the Gaza border, horrifying accounts filled the Western media. Propaganda functions to convince us that our enemies are the worst humans imaginable. Hamas has committed war crimes in these communities, this is irrefutable. And, the Israeli propaganda machine is using these crimes to enact genocide. The massacres in Israeli communities and at the music festival shock one's conscience—as it should—but where was the world's conscience during the dozens of times that pre- and post-state Israel massacred or aided in the massacre of civilians in Deir Yassin, Tantura, Kafr Qasim, Sabra and Shatila refugee camps, Jenin refugee camp, and its seven bombing operations on Gaza in the last two decades? Why are there no cries of outrage for the dead Palestinian babies pulled from buildings destroyed by Israeli weapons of mass destruction? Within the last eight days, Israel has killed more than 700 children in Gaza. Here are some foundational truths that apply to the current war between Hamas and Israel: Israel signed the Geneva Conventions, which forbids killing civilians in time of war. Prophet Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him), Islamic law, and the Cairo Declaration of Human Rights in Islam, have all forbidden the killing of civilians in wartime. The Israeli military occupation of Palestine and siege on Gaza violates the Geneva Conventions and <u>numerous other international laws</u>. To end the killing of Israeli and Palestinian civilians, Palestinians must be free. Read the full article by Kathy Kern for Community Peacemaker Teams here.
