## Peacebuilding efforts continue in Ecuador

Injustice in Ecuador, especially for Indigenous Peoples, has ignited protests, national uprisings and strikes over the past four decades, which are increasing in frequency. Although Ecuador's constitution and international law recognize Indigenous Peoples' rights, United Nations experts found "persistent gaps" in the enforcement of these rights, especially regarding mineral extraction and development in Indigenous territories. Furthermore, Indigenous communities are typically located in rural areas where the percentage of people living in poverty is double that of people in urban areas. Poverty contributes to the lack of access to basic services, including health care. This socioeconomic chasm has contributed to unrest. Mennonite Mission Network has had a presence in Ecuador for over 30 years and, for over 20 years, has supported Ecuadorian partners through the Ecuador Partnership, which is made up of Mission Network, Iglesia Cristiana Menonita de Colombia (IMCOL) and Central Plains Mennonite Conference, a conference of Mennonite Church USA. At the request of the Council of Indigenous Evangelical Nations and Organizations of Ecuador (FEINE) President Eustaquio Tuala, Mission Network held a workshop for FEINE leaders, Dec. 8-10, 2022. The workshop was led by Ecuador Partnership cocoordinator Peter Wigginton and training and resource specialist — church planting Mauricio Chenlo, along with Dr. Julián Guamán, general secretary of Iglesia Cristiana Menonita de Ecuador (ICME). Twenty-two FEINE leaders participated in the workshop at FEINE's national office in Quito, Ecuador. Fifty church leaders attended the workshop, which focused on faith and politics, as well as methods of nonviolent direct action and reconciliation. # Hesston College faculty vote to express no confidence in president

Hesston College faculty members on Sept. 5 voted to express no confidence in President Joseph A. Manickam. The motion cited "failure to lead effectively, lack of taking responsibility, [and] inappropriate or unprofessional behavior." The vote was 24 to 2, or 92.3%, with six abstaining. Eight voting-eligible faculty did not attend the meeting. ## In the News with JIP



Below is a message shared by The Immigration Project (TIP).

This month The Immigration Project's Social Service Director Sarah Mellor was able to talk with WGLT to discuss the lack of bilingual counselors nationwide, and specifically in Illinois. While there has been an increase in the need for Spanish-speaking counselors, there has been a decrease in mental health treatment facilities that offer Spanish services.

Unfortunately, this is not just a problem for Spanish-speaking immigrants. Those who have other native languages are at a stronger disadvantage since they are less likely to find counselors that are fluent in the same language as them. However, The Immigration Project is working towards fixing this problem.

At The Immigrant Project, we strive to ensure that we are providing the necessary resources for immigrants within our service areas! We are proud to employ the only certified bilingual HUD housing counselor in downstate Illinois. As our organization and staff continue to grow, we will continue to provide the essential necessities to our community!

## Mennonite Central Committee receives \$229.6 million gift

Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) is honoured to announce a remarkable gift of \$229.6 million in property given to MCC British Columbia by an individual donor in support of the organization's international relief, development and peace work. Henry Rempel of New Westminster, B.C., who died June 9, 2023, and his wife, Mary Rempel, who predeceased her husband in 2014, wanted to help "the poorest of the poor." Henry has gifted a large portfolio of rental and development properties to MCC for the ongoing support of MCC's ministry. The properties are located across British Columbia, held in subsidiary companies owned by MCC B.C., and collectively referred to as HyLand Properties. HyLand is also managing previous gifts of real estate from the Rempels, beginning with their first donation of property in 2012. HyLand's purpose is to operate the full portfolio of properties on an ongoing basis and to generate annual income for MCC, similar to an endowment. "We are incredibly grateful for this generous gift," says Wayne Bremner, executive director of MCC B.C. "We know that, globally, more than 110 million people have been forced to flee their homes. And more than 800 million — one in ten — go to bed on an empty stomach each night. The needs around the world are staggering, and this gift will increase MCC's capacity to respond. "We are humbled that Henry and Mary chose to partner with MCC to steward this generous and strategic gift to assist the world's most vulnerable people," says Bremner.
