Yesterday, I attended a Zoom gathering of the *Supportive Communities Network* (SCN)-a program of *Brethren Mennonite Council for LGBT Interests (BMC)*--of which MCN is a part, alongside about 60+ leaders from across the country. We heard stories of LGBTQIA+ advocacy from a Church of the Brethren congregation in Lancaster County, PA, spent time in smaller groups sharing our stories and ideas, and then divided by affiliation to discuss issues on the denominational level. For Mennonites, there are ongoing efforts across the country to encourage Mennonite Central Committee to change their discriminatory hiring policies--many writing letters, or sending notes each time their church sends a contribution to MCC. It was inspiring and encouraging conversation! 

Maritoba MB church on its way out

The membership of Winnipeg's River East Church in the Mennonite Brethren Church of Manitoba (MBCM) will end May 31 unless the church decides to return "to an active embrace of MBCM member church expectations" regarding LGBTQ inclusion and same-sex marriage. That was the resolution approved Jan. 20 by delegates to a special MBCM session in that Manitoba city. At the same time, delegates said the church is welcome to return to the conference if it decides to live in accordance with the conference's belief that marriage is only between men and women. In response, River East Pastor Mary Anne Isaak noted that the church had been nurtured by the conference for six decades and participated in joint ministry with other churches in Manitoba and across Canada during that time. She said River East has "heard God calling us to move in a new direction. Hesston dedicates healing circle acknowledging shortcomings

Hesston College dedicated a monument acknowledging "shortcomings and errors" and "acts of violence that have broken the bonds of trust in our community" Dec. 4, more than a year and a half after the Healing Circle was constructed on campus. The event — part of the college's first Unity Day — took place one year after students walked out of Formation (chapel) Dec. 2, 2022, and gathered at the circle to protest what student leaders described as an unsafe campus where staff minimized or ignored reports of sexual assault. **Read more in the Anabaptist World's article here**. act now to save asylum



Background: The Biden Administration and members of the Senate are currently negotiating a deal that, if finalized, will make drastic changes to our asylum system. As part of a \$110 billion supplemental funding package, lawmakers are trying to pair harsh immigration restrictions with foreign aid funding to appease a wide range of Democrats and Republicans. Recent reporting suggests that negotiators are considering the following provisions:

- Giving the president expanded authority to expel migrants without asylum screenings, similar to the "Title 42" policy.
- Raising the standard for deciding whether someone has a "credible fear" of returning to their home country. These changes will make it more difficult to claim asylum.
- Expanding expedited removal and mandating immigrant detention for arriving asylum seekers making it more difficult to consult with legal representation and resulting in the mistreatment and removal of vulnerable people, including families.

Faith reflection: Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. Ephesians 2:19 (NIV)

"If you've never been there, why do you care?" Anna Johnson asked Kelsey Cramer (my sister-in-law) and me on our way from South Bend to Goshen, Ind., in a 12-passenger van to pick up the rest of our carpool heading to Washington, D.C., on a subzero January morning. Anna is a Ph.D. candidate in peace studies and sociology, researching the possibilities of peace-and-justice tourism in Palestine. Having grown up Lutheran, she became Mennonite after encountering Mennonite Central Committee workers in Palestine, where she lived for seven years. For Anna, the atrocities in Palestine are personal. But why, she wondered out loud, were we joining her in an act of civil disobedience? Kelsey described how her heart broke for Palestinians as she watched the atrocities on social media. I stumbled through a response, but the question haunted me throughout the whirlwind of the next two days.
