

A vigil is planned for today, February 28th at 5:00pm at Heartland Community College. We will meet outside the Astroth Community Education Building, lower level southeast entrance.

This vigil will be followed by the Prairie Pride Coalition Town Hall meeting inside the same building from 6:00pm-7:30pm. A focus of this meeting with be LGBTQ safety.

## a Note from Phil

#### Monday, March 4th at 1 pm gathering at MCN

I'm going to US Representative Eric Sorensen's office on Monday, March 4th at 2:00 pm to let him know that I am working with Mennonites who want the US government to push harder for a ceasefire in Gaza, for the US to quit sending arms to Israel until they quit bombing Gaza, for the US to push for a two-state solution in Israel, and for the US to reinstate financial contributions to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) so it can proide assistance to Palestinian refugees.

The Biden administration recently halted U.S. funding for the UNRWA. According to MCC, since 1948 UNRWA has been the most important on-the-ground organization providing vital humanitarian assistance for Palestinian refugees. In addition to its role in meeting basic needs, UNRWA is vital to broader rights for Palestinians, including their status as refugees and any right of return for those displaced.

We will be gathering at the Mennonite Church of Normal at 1:00 pm on March 4th for a visit to US Representative Sorensen's office in Peoria. Please bring a sign if you choose to join us.

The 66th annual Illinois Relief Sale will be held March 16. Signup sheets are available at the church. Here are some of the ways all can help:

- Donations are needed for the auction. Each church is asked to donate at least 5 items for the auction. Some suggestions are given below. March 1 is the deadline for signup so it can be included in booklet.
- Quilt Items: Put your sewing skills to use and make a guilt or comforter or wall hanging to donate to the quilt auction. Vintage quilts are also accepted. Auction times the day of the sale for the guilts are 9:00 am, 11:00 am and 1:00 pm. If you have any questions check with Louise Reeser.
- <u>Dutch Market</u>: A variety of baked goods are needed. Suggestions are cookies, brownies, cinnamon rolls, breads, tea rings, candy and cakes (such as carrot, angel food, or coffee cakes.) - The warning signs of suicide
- How to get help for someone in crisis

# Breaking chains, mending walls at Hope for the Future

"Do we know what it means to remove chains?" asked Joanne Gallardo, co-conference minister for Indiana-Michigan Mennonite Conference at Mennonite Church USA's (MC USA's) 11th Hope for the Future conference on Feb. 9-11. Gathering in Dallas, Texas, 70 Black, Indigenous and people of color considered the theme, "Breaking Chains, Mending Walls," which centered on Isaiah 58. "Every year, we're trying to see where we are as a church. Reading the times and trying to find a message of hope for us," said Sue Park-Hur, MC USA director of racial/ethnic engagement. Park-Hur shared how the passage resonated with members of the planning committee – Marco Güete, Abby Endashaw, Mahlet Mamo and Ana Hinojosa. "In times of difficulty and traumatic times, we look to rituals and ancient practices to help us be rooted," said Park-Hur. "And Isaiah 58 reminds us of the heart of these rituals."
